9 Section 1. Appropriation. There is appropriated to the department of health and environmental sciences from the 10 11 general fund \$50,000 for the biennium ending June 30, 1989, 12 to fund grants to nonprofit organizations for services to 13 pregnant teenagers and teenage mothers, as provided in 14 sections 2 and 3.

15 Section 2. Request for proposals to provide services to pregnant teenagers and teenage mothers. The department of 16 health and environmental sciences is authorized to issue a 17 18 request for proposals from nonprofit organizations to initiate a program offering counseling, child care, 19 20 education, and training to mothers and pregnant women who are under age 21 and have not completed high school. 21

22 Section 3. Award of grants -- program priorities. (1) 23 The department of health and environmental sciences shall 24 select two nonprofit organizations to receive grants of 25 \$25,000 apiece to establish a program for teenage mothers



1	and expectant mothers in one or more local high schools.
2	(2) To be eligible for a grant under subsection (1), a
3	program must include the following elements:
4	(a) prenatal health care and counseling;
5	(b) training or counseling to promote self-esteem;
6	(c) vocational education or training;
7	<pre>(d) parenting skills training;</pre>
8	(e) child care for mothers in high school or
9	vocational education classes; and

10 (f) employment counseling.
