 4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO RELOCATE THE MONTANA
 5 LAW ENFORCEMENT ACADEMY TO LEWISTOWN, MONTANA; TO AUTHORIZE
 6 THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE TO PURCHASE FACILITIES TO HOUSE
 7 THE ACADEMY; TO APPROPRIATE MONEY; AMENDING SECTIONS
 8 44-10-103 AND 44-10-202, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE
 9 DATE."

 11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
 12 Section 1. Section 44-10-103, MCA, is amended to read:
 13 "44-10-103. Establishment of academy. There is hereby
 14 established a Montana law enforcement academy located in
 15 Lewistown, Montana."
 16 Section 2. Section 44-10-202, MCA, is amended to read:
 17 "44-10-202. Powers and duties of department. The
 18 department of justice shall have the power and it shall be
 19 its duty to:
 20 (1) acquire facilities in Lewistown suitable for
 21 housing the academy;
 22 (2) contract for services needed for operation of the
 23 academy;
 24 (3) establish qualifications for admission to the
 25 academy;

1 ~~(2)~~(4) select from among the qualified applicants
 2 those officers who are to attend the academy each year;
 3 ~~(3)~~(5) determine the curriculum and methods of
 4 training for the officers attending the academy;
 5 ~~(4)~~(6) select and hire such staff as it deems
 6 necessary to implement this chapter;
 7 ~~(5)~~(7) establish rules for the conduct of the officers
 8 at the academy;
 9 ~~(6)~~(8) award appropriate certificates to the officers
 10 who successfully complete their training;
 11 ~~(7)~~(9) provide for the keeping of permanent records of
 12 enrollment, attendance, and graduation and such other
 13 records as the department may deem necessary;
 14 ~~(8)~~(10) make a yearly report in writing of the
 15 activities of the academy. Copies of this report shall be
 16 sent to the governor, attorney general, and secretary of
 17 state.
 18 ~~(9)~~(11) do all other things necessary and desirable for
 19 the establishment and operation of the academy not
 20 inconsistent with this chapter or the constitution and
 21 statutes of the state of Montana;
 22 ~~(10)~~(12) accept and expend grants from federal, state,
 23 county, and city governments or private persons,
 24 associations, or corporations."
 25 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Authority to purchase academy



1 facilities. The department of justice shall purchase
2 facilities in Lewistown to serve as the Montana law
3 enforcement academy. Such facilities must consist of:

- 4 (1) administrative offices;
- 5 (2) dormitories;
- 6 (3) a classroom and training building;
- 7 (4) an athletic facility; and
- 8 (5) other facilities that meet the needs of the
9 academy.

10 NEW SECTION. Section 4. Appropriation. There is
11 appropriated \$200,000 from the motor vehicle account of the
12 state special revenue fund to the department of justice for
13 the purchase of facilities in Lewistown to house the Montana
14 law enforcement academy.

15 NEW SECTION. Section 5. Extension of authority. Any
16 existing authority of the department of justice to make
17 rules on the subject of the provisions of this act is
18 extended to the provisions of this act.

19 NEW SECTION. Section 6. Effective date. This act is
20 effective July 1, 1987.

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB903, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to relocate the Montana Law Enforcement Academy to Lewistown, Montana.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Food service will be supplied by the Center for the Aged for \$5 per day per student.
2. Remodeling costs of \$16,500 will be sufficient to bring the Lewistown site to a state of readiness.
3. HB291 and HB492 will pass to generate sufficient revenue in the Motor Vehicle Account to cover the \$200,000 appropriation for purchase of the Lewistown facilities.

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HB2 authorizes the Department of Justice to purchase the buildings at the Bozeman facility. If this occurs the operating costs at Bozeman will be reduced by \$96,000. \$55,000 is required for maintenance and utility costs. The rent cost for the Lewistown facility will be decreased by \$37,112.
