INTRODUCED BY Whaley Ran Blanfool RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA EXPRESSING SUPPORT FOR THE BOYCOTT OF CALIFORNIA GRAPES BY THE UNITED FARM 7 WORKERS OF AMERICA AND URGING ALL CITIZENS OF MONTANA TO 8 PARTICIPATE IN THE GRAPE BOYCOTT IN SUPPORT OF THE UNITED FARM WORKERS AND THEIR PRESIDENT, CESAR CHAVEZ. 9 10 11 WHEREAS, California grape growers are conducting an advertising campaign to convince Montanans and other 12 consumers to buy table grapes as a natural food snack; and 13 14 WHEREAS, in 1984, California growers dumped 310,289,990 pounds of toxic pesticides on their fields and crops -- more 15 16 than half of the 600,000,000 pounds of regulated chemicals sold in the United States that year; and 17 18 WHEREAS, a World Resources Institute report shows that more than 300,000 farm workers are poisoned by pesticides in 19 20 the United States each year; and 21 WHEREAS, small California communities are becoming

afflicted with cancer caused by pesticides that growers

spray on their crops and by nitrates that leach into the

ground water supply after growers apply nitrogen fertilizers

to the soil: and WHEREAS, the peril of pesticides reaches consumers through poisonous residue left on the fruits and vegetables they purchase at the market; and WHEREAS, at least four pesticides used on grapes -parathion, phosdrin, methyl bromide, and dinoseb -- pose a particular danger to farm workers and consumers; and WHEREAS, a fifth pesticide, captan, while not an acutely toxic poison, is a threat to human life because it causes cancer and birth defects; and WHEREAS, California grape growers have exhibited a callous attitude toward pesticide poisonings that are occurring in the grape fields; and WHEREAS, the California growers have strenuously resisted a proposal to participate in a program to test table grapes for pesticide residues; and WHEREAS, since the 1960's the United Farm Workers of

WHEREAS, the United Farm Workers have embarked on a nationwide effort to inform the American people about the toxic chemicals used on grapes and about the pesticide poisoning of California farm workers; and

WHEREAS, the United Farm Workers, under the leadership

 grapes; and
 - WHEREAS, the purpose of the grape boycott is to protect farm workers and consumers from toxic pesticides, as well as to win a desperate fight for the rights of farm workers to safe working conditions and a decent living; and
- WHEREAS, Cesar Chavez has personally visited Montana to
 seek support for the United Farm Workers boycott; and
