 4 A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF
 5 Keenan REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA EXPRESSING SUPPORT
 6 FOR THE BOYCOTT OF CALIFORNIA GRAPES BY THE UNITED FARM
 7 WORKERS OF AMERICA AND URGING ALL CITIZENS OF MONTANA TO
 8 PARTICIPATE IN THE GRAPE BOYCOTT IN SUPPORT OF THE UNITED
 9 FARM WORKERS AND THEIR PRESIDENT, CESAR CHAVEZ.

 11 WHEREAS, California grape growers are conducting an
 12 advertising campaign to convince Montanans and other
 13 consumers to buy table grapes as a natural food snack; and

14 WHEREAS, in 1984, California growers dumped 310,289,990
 15 pounds of toxic pesticides on their fields and crops -- more
 16 than half of the 600,000,000 pounds of regulated chemicals
 17 sold in the United States that year; and

18 WHEREAS, a World Resources Institute report shows that
 19 more than 300,000 farm workers are poisoned by pesticides in
 20 the United States each year; and

21 WHEREAS, small California communities are becoming
 22 afflicted with cancer caused by pesticides that growers
 23 spray on their crops and by nitrates that leach into the
 24 ground water supply after growers apply nitrogen fertilizers

1 to the soil; and

2 WHEREAS, the peril of pesticides reaches consumers
 3 through poisonous residue left on the fruits and vegetables
 4 they purchase at the market; and

5 WHEREAS, at least four pesticides used on grapes --
 6 parathion, phosdrin, methyl bromide, and dinoseb -- pose a
 7 particular danger to farm workers and consumers; and

8 WHEREAS, a fifth pesticide, captan, while not an
 9 acutely toxic poison, is a threat to human life because it
 10 causes cancer and birth defects; and

11 WHEREAS, California grape growers have exhibited a
 12 callous attitude toward pesticide poisonings that are
 13 occurring in the grape fields; and

14 WHEREAS, the California growers have strenuously
 15 resisted a proposal to participate in a program to test
 16 table grapes for pesticide residues; and

17 WHEREAS, since the 1960's the United Farm Workers of
 18 America, AFL-CIO, have maintained a constant struggle for
 19 the rights of thousands of farm workers who toil in the
 20 California fields; and

21 WHEREAS, the United Farm Workers have embarked on a
 22 nationwide effort to inform the American people about the
 23 toxic chemicals used on grapes and about the pesticide
 24 poisoning of California farm workers; and

25 WHEREAS, the United Farm Workers, under the leadership

1 of Cesar Chavez, have called for a boycott of California
2 grapes; and

3 WHEREAS, the purpose of the grape boycott is to protect
4 farm workers and consumers from toxic pesticides, as well as
5 to win a desperate fight for the rights of farm workers to
6 safe working conditions and a decent living; and

7 WHEREAS, Cesar Chavez has personally visited Montana to
8 seek support for the United Farm Workers boycott; and

9 WHEREAS, the people of Montana must stand with the
10 United Farm Workers in their resolve to improve the lives of
11 farm workers and to halt the senseless pesticide poisonings
12 taking place in California.

14 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
15 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

16 That the Legislature of the State of Montana supports
17 the boycott of California grapes by the United Farm Workers
18 of America.

19 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Legislature urges all
20 citizens of Montana to participate in the grape boycott in
21 support of Cesar Chavez and the United Farm Workers.

22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State
23 transmit a copy of this resolution to the Honorable George
24 Deukmejian, Governor of California; the President of the
25 California State Senate; the Speaker of the California State

1 Assembly; and Mr. Cesar Chavez, President of the United Farm
2 Workers of America.
