 10 WHEREAS, the Private Industry Councils of Montana,
 11 established in accordance with the provisions of Public Law
 12 97-300, have been granted the authority to advise the
 13 Department of Labor and Industry regarding the expenditure
 14 of funds appropriated under the Job Training Partnership
 15 Act; and

16 WHEREAS, the Legislature has constitutional authority
 17 in the appropriation process to establish the purposes for
 18 the expenditure of state money; and

19 WHEREAS, the Legislature has designated the training
 20 and job placement of low-income Montana residents and the
 21 chronically unemployed as the highest priority objective for
 22 expenditure of Job Training Partnership Act funds; and

23 WHEREAS, the Legislature has approved the expenditure
 24 of Job Training Partnership Act money to address the needs
 25 of the long-term unemployed; and

1 WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes the need for local
 2 participation through use of the resources of county
 3 government, county agencies, and local work task forces.

 5 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
 6 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

7 (1) That the highest priority of the Private Industry
 8 Councils during the 1988-89 biennium be the rehabilitation
 9 of chronically unemployed workers through the use of Job
 10 Training Partnership Act funds.

11 (2) That the Private Industry Councils request the
 12 chief elected officials to identify the targeted population
 13 within each county.

14 (3) That each participating organization provide a
 15 plan of action including clear goals and measurable
 16 objectives for future funding.

17 (4) That continued funding of existing programs be
 18 based on performance success.

19 (5) That incentive awards provided to projects be
 20 based in part upon retention in employment.

WHEREAS, the Private-Industry-Councils-of--Montana JOB TRAINING COORDINATING COUNCIL, established in accordance with the provisions of Public Law 97-300, have-been--granted the-authority-to-advise-the-Department-of-Labor-and-Industry regarding--the--expenditure--of-funds-appropriated--under-the Job-Training-Partnership-Act,-and HAS BEEN GRANTED AUTHORITY TO RECOMMEND A GOVERNOR'S COORDINATION AND SPECIAL SERVICES PLAN; AND

WHEREAS, the Legislature has constitutional authority in the appropriation process to establish the purposes for the expenditure of state money; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature has designated the training and job placement of low-income Montana residents and the

chronically unemployed as the--highest A HIGH priority objective for expenditure of Job Training Partnership Act funds; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature has approved the expenditure of Job Training Partnership Act money to address the needs of the long-term unemployed; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes the need for local participation through use of the resources of county government, county agencies, and local work task forces.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

2 BEGINNING WITH THE FISCAL YEAR 1989 PLANNING CYCLE, THE
3 JOB TRAINING COORDINATING COUNCIL SHALL DEVELOP A GOVERNOR'S
4 COORDINATION AND SPECIAL SERVICES PLAN FOR PURPOSES OF
5 ENSURING:

6 (1) THAT SERVICE TO CHRONICALLY UNEMPLOYED WORKERS BE
7 GIVEN A HIGH PRIORITY IN EACH SERVICE DELIVERY AREA'S JOB
8 TRAINING PLAN;

9 (2) THAT TARGETED POPULATIONS ARE IDENTIFIED IN EACH
10 SERVICE DELIVERY AREA'S JOB TRAINING PLAN DEVELOPED IN
11 COORDINATION WITH CHIEF ELECTED OFFICIALS;

12 (3) THAT EACH SERVICE DELIVERY AREA'S JOB TRAINING
13 PLAN INCLUDES CLEAR GOALS AND MEASURABLE OBJECTIVES;

14 (4) THAT EACH SERVICE DELIVERY AREA GIVES PROPER
15 CONSIDERATION TO AWARDING FUNDS TO PROGRAM OPERATORS BASED
16 ON PERFORMANCE SUCCESS, RECOGNIZING QUALITY AND NOT QUANTITY
17 PLACEMENT; AND

18 (5) THAT EACH SERVICE DELIVERY AREA BE ASSESSED ON THE
19 CRITERIA OF RETENTION IN EMPLOYMENT WITH THE LONG-TERM GOAL
20 OF USING RETENTION IN EMPLOYMENT AS PART OF THE BASIS FOR
21 AWARDING INCENTIVE FUNDS TO SERVICE DELIVERY AREAS.
