INTRODUCED BY *Norman*

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROHIBITING PAYMENT OF WORKERS' COMPENSATION DISABILITY BENEFITS TO A PERSON INCARCERATED IN A CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTION FOR A FELONY."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Prohibiting benefits to person incarcerated for felony. A claimant is not entitled to and may not receive any disability compensation benefits while he is incarcerated in a correctional institution for a felony.

Section 2. Extension of authority. Any existing authority of the division of workers' compensation to make rules on the subject of the provisions of this act is extended to the provisions of this act.

Section 3. Codification instruction. Section 1 is intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 39, chapter 71, part 7, and the provisions of Title 39, chapter 71, part 7, apply to section 1.


