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BY REQUEST OF THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE

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A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT RAISING THE AMOUNTS OF PROPERTY DAMAGE RESULTING FROM A MOTOR VEHICLE ACCIDENT THAT TRIGGER NOTIFICATION TO AND REPORTING BY LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS; AND AMENDING SECTIONS 61-7-108 AND 61-7-109, MCA."

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 61-7-108, MCA, is amended to read: "61-7-108. Immediate notice of accidents. The driver of a vehicle involved in an accident resulting in injury to or death of any person or property damage to an apparent extent of \$100 \$250 or more shall immediately by the quickest means of communication give notice of such accident to the local police department if such accident occurs within a municipality, otherwise to the office of the county sheriff or the nearest office of the highway patrol."

Section 2. Section 61-7-109, MCA, is amended to read: "61-7-109. Written reports of accidents -- additional information -- form of report. (1) The operator of any motor vehicle which is in any manner involved in an accident within this state in which any person is killed or injured or in which damage to the property of any one person in excess of \$250 \$400 is sustained shall, within 10 days after such accident, report the matter in writing to the department unless the accident was investigated and reported by a law enforcement officer as provided in subsection (3).

- (2) The department may require any driver of a vehicle involved in an accident of which report must be made as provided in this section to file supplemental reports whenever the original report is insufficient and may require witnesses of accidents to render reports.
  - (3) Every law enforcement officer who in the regular course of duty investigates a motor vehicle accident in which any person is killed or injured or in which damage to the property of any person exceeds \$250 \$400, either at the time of and at the scene of the accident or thereafter by interviewing participants or witnesses, shall within 10 days after completing the investigation forward a written report of the accident to the department.
  - (4) The form of the accident report required under this section shall contain information sufficient to enable the department to determine whether the requirements for the deposit of security for safety responsibility are inapplicable by reason of the existence of insurance or other exemptions specified in this part."

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Extension of authority. Any existing authority of the department of justice to make
