In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB127, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act requiring a student participating in a program of interstate compact professional education, such as the WICHE, WAMI, or Minnesota Rural Dentistry Program, to repay 25 percent of state support fees paid by the state on his behalf: exempting students currently participating in such programs: providing repayment schedules.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- The payback program must be implemented in FY88 and will be administered by the existing staff in the 1. Commissioner of Higher Education's Office.
- In order to protect the integrity of the program and to assure legal authority to collect the loan, proper 2. and legal forms which provide adequate terms and disclosures to the borrower must be developed. The cost of developing and printing the appropriate forms and the cost of obtaining proper legal opinion would cost up to \$10,000.
- Creation and maintenance of an account on the data is \$7.00 per account. 3.
- Servicing an in-school account is \$1.90 per month per account. 4.
- Fifty-one new students enter the WICHE/WAMI and related programs per year. 5.

3 Senate Education and Cultural Resources Committee

5 A statement of intent is required for this bill because rulemaking authority is granted to the commissioner of 6 7 higher education in section 1. Although the provisions of 8 the Montana Administrative Procedure Act do not apply to the 9 board of regents or the university system, 5-4-404 requires a statement of intent whenever a bill delegates authority. 10 Since this bill delegates authority, a statement of intent 11 is attached. 12

It is intended that the commissioner administer the 13 repayment provisions to the greatest benefit to the state, 14 which includes the encouragement of professional training 15 16 for its citizens as well as a partial payback of some of the state's investment. The commissioner shall explicitly define 17 the interstate compact programs involved, with the 18 legislature intending that WICHE, WAMI, and the Minnesota 19 20 rural dentistry programs be covered. The commissioner shall 21 have the ability to alter the rules to cover the status of the compacts. It is not intended that the commissioner pick 22 23 and choose among defined programs--all must be covered 24 equally.
