Operators may include but are not limited to the 8 United States forest service, the Montana department of 9 fish, wildlife. and parks, the Montana snowmobile 10 association, individual snowmobile clubs, persons who offer 11 snowmobile equipment for rent, and private trail grooming 12 contractors.

13 (4) "Snowmobiler" means any person operating or riding14 a snowmobile.

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Snowmobile area operators -duties -- restriction on liability. (1) The person responsible for the maintenance of or operation of a snowmobile area shall mark all trail maintenance vehicles and furnish the vehicles with flashing or rotating lights that must be in operation whenever the vehicles are working or are in movement in the snowmobile area.

(2) A snowmobile area operator is liable for death or
injury to a snowmobiler or other person or property only for
an act or omission that constitutes willful or wanton
misconduct.

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1 (3) Except as provided in this section, a snowmobile 2 area operator has no duty to eliminate, alter, control, or 3 lessen the risk inherent in the sport of snowmobiling. A 4 snowmobile area operator who attempts to eliminate, alter, 5 control, or lessen the risk inherent in the sport of 6 snowmobiling is liable only for an act or omission that 7 constitutes willful or wanton misconduct.

NEW SECTION. Section 4. Snowmobiler's assumption of 8 responsibility -- duties. (2) A snowmobiler is responsible for:

(a) knowing the range of his own ability to snowmobile
any slope, trail, or area and for snowmobiling within the
limits of his ability considering the conditions;

(b) maintaining control of his speed and course at alltimes while snowmobiling:

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(c) heeding all posted warnings; and

(d) refraining from acting in a manner that may cause

2 or contribute to the injury of anyone.

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3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 5. Maintenance of rental 4 snowmobiles. A person who engages in the business of renting 5 snowmobiles to another shall:

6 (1) maintain rental snowmobiles in a safe condition;
