In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB171, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

This bill repeals the requirement that waterfowl hunters must purchase an upland game bird license in addition to the state and federal waterfowl stamps.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The majority of the waterfowl hunters also hunt upland game birds. Consequently we anticipate a very small decline in the number of bird licenses sold.
- 2. Because this bill repeals the requirement that waterfowl hunters buy a bird license in addition to the state and federal duck stamps, we anticipate a small increase in the number of waterfowl hunters.

FISCAL IMPACT:

We estimate that the anticipated decline in bird licenses sold will be offset by the increase in waterfowl stamps sold, resulting in no significant revenue import from passage of this bill.
