In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB238, as introduced.

## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A bill for an act entitled: "An act to impose a surcharge on the retail sale of field rodenticides and to authorize the Department of Agriculture to expend these funds for vertebrate pest management purposes; to establish a vertebrate pest management advisory council; amending section 80-7-1102, MCA; and providing an immediate effective date."

## ASSUMPTIONS:

- EPA proposes cancellation of strychnine, zinc phosphide and Compound 1080 for use as rodenticides unless registration data requirements can be filled. These data requirements include: residue chemistry data for rodenticide use on croplands; fate (degradation and mobility in soil) of the rodenticide compounds in the environment; wildlife and aquatic organism data including secondary hazard studies; toxicology data; and efficacy data.
- 2. The registrants of these products are small businesses and have neither the funds nor the personnel to carry out the required research to achieve registration.
- 3. If the states currently using strychnine, and potentially 1080 as rodenticides, wish to maintain these registrations, the needed data will have to be generated by them.

It is the intent of the legislature that the department 11 adopt rules for the orderly administration of the 12 rodenticide fund and the collection of revenue as provided 13 in the bill. The department shall provide a method of giving 14 notice to the rodenticide registrant and a procedure for 15 payment of the surcharge. 16

17 It is the intent of the legislature that the department adopt rules relating to the expenditure of funds generated 18 by this bill. Specifically, the department shall use the 19 criteria stated in 80-7-1102 and 80-7-1103 as the basis for 20 the expenditure of the funds. The legislature intends that 21 the money given in the form of grants and contracts be 22 primarily on a cost-share basis. The department shall 23 determine the ratio of cost sharing by considering the 24 entity being given the money, its ability to find other 25



sources of funding, the need for the project for which it 1 receives the money, and the amount of benefit it bestows on 2 the area involved. The legislature intends that projects 3 involving greater community action and benefit receive 4 5

increased priority.
