BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Definitions. Unless the context requires otherwise, as used in {sections 1 through 4}, the following definitions apply:

- (1) "Motor fuel" means gasoline or diesel fuel of a type distributed for use in self-propelled motor vehicles and includes gasohol and aviation fuels.
- (2) "Motor fuel franchise" means an oral or written contract, either expressed or implied, between a motor fuel supplier and motor fuel retailer under which the motor fuel retailer is supplied motor fuel for sale to the public, and includes any agreements between a motor fuel supplier and motor fuel retailer under which the retailer is permitted to occupy premises owned, leased, or controlled by the supplier for the purpose of engaging in the retail sale of motor fuel supplied by the motor fuel supplier.
 - (3) "Motor fuel retailer" means a person, firm,

association, or corporation engaged primarily in the sale of motor fuel pursuant to a motor fuel franchise entered into with a motor fuel supplier or other seller of motor fuel.

- 4 (4) "Motor fuel supplier" means a person, firm,
 5 association, or corporation, including an affiliate of the
 6 person, firm, association, or corporation, engaged in the
 7 refining of crude oil into petroleum who supplies motor fuel
 8 for sale, consignment, or distribution through retail
 9 outlets.
- 10 (5) "Retail motor fuel outlet" means a location where
 11 motor fuel is distributed for purposes other than resale.

Section 2. Limitation of motor fuel supplier -- retail
motor fuel outlet -- exception. (1) (a) Except as provided
in [section 3], after July 1, 1987, a motor fuel supplier
may not open and operate a retail motor fuel outlet in this
state:

- (i) with company personnel, a subsidiary company, or acommissioned agent; or
- 19 (ii) under a contract with any firm or corporation 20 managing such outlet on a fee arrangement with the motor 21 fuel supplier.
- 22 (b) A retail motor fuel outlet must be operated by a 23 motor fuel retailer.
- . 24 (2) (a) Except as provided in {section 3}, after
 25 December 31, 1987, a motor fuel supplier may not operate a

- 9 Section 3. Temporary operation, A motor fuel supplier 10 may open and temporarily operate a retail motor fuel outlet 11 for a period not exceeding 90 days under circumstances in 12 which:
 - (1) a motor fuel retailer voluntarily terminates or voluntarily agrees not to renew the motor fuel franchise; or
 - (2) the franchise is terminated or not renewed by the motor fuel supplier under applicable state and federal laws.
 - Section 4. Period of allowed operation. During a period of operation allowed to a motor fuel supplier by [section 2 or 3], it is unlawful for the motor fuel supplier to sell to a motor fuel retailer at a price more than 5 cents above the price of the motor fuel sold at the
