be it enacted by the legislature of the state of montana:
Section 1. Section 23-5-603, MCA, is amended to read:
"23-5-603. Video draw poker machines -- possession -play -- restriction. No person may place an electronic video game machine that simulates or offers a game of poker in his licensed establishment unless he-is-tieensed-under--z3-5-6łz it meets the specifications prescribed in 23-5-606. Machines ficensed---under---z3-5-67z meeting the specifications prescribed in 23-5-606 are legal, and it is legal to play such machines, except that a person under the age of 18 years may not play a video draw poker machine. The provisions of part 3 of this chapter do not apply to or prohibit video draw poker machines or the playing of such machines."

Section 2. Section 23-5-605, MCA, is amended to read: "23-5-605. Powers and duties of the department -ticensing machine certification. (1) The department shall administer the provisions of this part, except 23-5-615.
(2) The department shall adopt rules implementing this part, except 23-5-615, and, with respect to state tieenses certification of machines:
(a) provide fieensing certification procedures;
(b) prescribe necessary application Eorms; and
(c) grant or deny tieense applications for certification.

Section 3. Section 23-5-606, MCA, is amended to read:
"23-5-606. Description and specifications. Each type of video draw poker machine must:
(1) be inspected in the state of Montana for certification and-ticensure by the departntent;
(2) be connected with a system consisting of player-operated terminals. The terminals must be intelligent

devices operated by the players in the manner specified in this part.
(3) not have any switches, jumpers, wire posts, or any other means of manipulation that could affect the operation or outcome of a game; and
(4) offer only the game of draw poker and have the following method of operation:
(a) the cards must be shuffled after each hand of poker is dealt
(b) the game must have one memory location for each card in the deck. The deck must be shuffled by use of a random number generator to exchange each card in the deck with another randomly selected card.
(c) after shuffling, five cards must be dealt from the top of the deck:
(d) any discarded cards must be replaced by remaining cards in the deck, starting with the sixth card and using the cards in the order of the deck;
(e) after the first five cards of $a$ hand have been dealt, the player may be allowed to raise his wager up to the amount of his initial ante, not to exceed eight quarters;
(f) the game must display the hands for which free games or credits will be awarded and the number of free games or credits for each hand;
(9) the machine must have doors to two locking areas, one area containing the logic board and software for the game draw poker and the other housing the cash compartment and mechanical meters. These areas must be locking and separated. Access to one from the other must not be allowed at any time.
(h) the machine must have two mechanisms, hereinafter referred to as "mechanism 1 " and "mechanism 2", that accept quarters;
(i) the machine must use a color display with images of cards that closely resemble standard poker playing cards;
(j) the machine must be capable of printing a ticket voucher for the player at the completion of each game. If credits are owed the player, the ticket must contain:
(i) the name of the licensed establishment;
(ii) the name of the city, town, or county in which the licensed establishment is located;
(iii) the value of the prize in numbers;
(iv) the value of the prize in words;
(v) the time of day, in hours and minutes in a 24-hour format;
(vi) the date;
(vii) the machine fieense-number-or serial number up to eight digits;
(viii) the sequential number of the ticket voucher: and

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    (ix) an encrypted validation number from which the
    validity of the prize can be determined;
    (k) an exact copy of each printed ticket voucher must
be printed and retained within the machine;
    (1) the machine must have nonresettable mechanical
meters housed in the cash compartment that keep a permanent
record of:
    (i) coins accepted by each coin acceptor;
    (ii) credits played by player;
    (iii) credits won by player; and
    (iv) credits printed out by the ticket voucher printer;
    (m) the machine must contain electronic metering,
using meters that record the following and display them on
the video screen:
    (i) total coins in mechanism 1, total coins in
mechanism 2, and total coins in mechanisms }1\mathrm{ and 2 combined;
    (ii) total credits, total credits played, and total
credits won;
    (iii) total hands of poker played and total hands of
poker won;
    (iv) total winning hands, consisting of a pair, two
pair, three of a kind, a straight, a flush, a full house,
four of a kind, a straight flush, or five of a kind;
    (v) total errors from the logic board random access
memory; and
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(vi) total examination of electronic meters;
( n ) the machine may not have a:l functions or parameters adjustable by or through any separate video display or input codes, except for the adjustment of features that are wholly cosmetic;
(0) the machine must issue, by activation of an external switch, an accounting ticket containing a performance synopsis of the machine. The ticket must contain:
(i) the name of the licensed establishment;
(ii) the name of the city, town, or county in which the licensed establishment is located;
(iii) the tieense serial number of the machine;
(iv) the time of day, in hours and minutes in a 24 -hour format ;
(v) the date; and
(vi) the electronic meter readings required by subsection (4)(m)."

Section 4. Section 23-5-611, MCA, is amended to read:
"23-5-611. State license qualifications -- limitations -- right to hearing. (1) A person who has been granted a license under 16-4-401(2) to sell aicoholic beverages for consumption on the premises may be-granted-a-tieense-for-the piacement-of place video draw poker machines in his licensed establishment.
（2）A licensee may not have on the premises or make available for play on the premises of his licensed establishment more than five machines．
（3）A person denied a state łieense certification has the right to a hearing before the department．The hearing must be conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Montana Administrative Procedure Act．＂

[^0](2) A violation of this part, except 23-5-615, or a rule promulgated under 23-5-605 is a criminal offense, and a fine not to exceed $\$ 10,000$ for the first violation and $\$ 15,000$ for a subsequent violation must be imposed.
(3) If a video draw poker machine is operated in violation of this part, except 23-5-615, it may be seized under 23-5-121 and the provisions of 23-5-122 apply.
(4) Employees of the department designated as enforcement agents may investigate the background of tieense certification applicants to the extent judged necessary by the department, but no person may be investigated prior to his submission of an application for a---ticense certification.
(5) Findings of suspected illegal activity must be reported to the appropriate law enforcement agency.
(6) Any peace officer of this state may arrest a person for tampering with a video draw poker machine, attempting or conspiring to manipulate the outcome or the payoff of a video draw poker machine, or manipulating the outcome or payoff of a video draw poker machine by physical tampering or other interference with the proper functioning of the machine."

Section 7. Section 23-5-615, MCA, is amended to read:
"23-5-615. Licensing by local governing bodies. (1) Any A city, town, or county governing body may must issue to
a person who meets the qualifications of 23-5~6ll a license for each video draw poker machine to be used on the premises of a licensed establishment. A machine may be licensed by a city or town if located in the city or town or by the county if the machine is not located in a city or town.
(2) In---addition---to--the--ticense--fee--paid--under z3-5-6yzf-a A governing body may charge an annual license fee for each license issued under this section. The license expires on June 30 of each year, and the fee must be prorated.

3. If passed, the proposed law would become effective on October 1, 1987. It would affect only 9 months of FY88 and all of FY89.
4. Under the proposed law, the Department of Revenue would certify 28 types of poker machines at $\$ 50$ per certification.
5. There will be 2,752 (full year) licensed video poker machines in Montana in FY88 and 2,780 (full year) in FY89 (REAC).
6. Under the proposed law, the average license fee is $\$ 1,250$.
7. It is the intent of the proposed law that the Department of Revenue investigate and inspect certified poker machines. Expenditures for investigations and inspections would be $\$ 100,000$ per year (Investigations and Enforcement Division Estimate).
8. Certification equipment: emulator @ $\$ 50,000$, other equipment © $\$ 25,000$. (One time Expenses).
9. Certification would require 1 FTE (grade 16 , step 2 , $\$ 26,716$ per year salary and benefits) and $1 / 2$ FTE(grade 7, step $2, \$ 8,425$ salaries and benefits plus $20 \%$ allowed for operating expenses).
10. It is not the intent of this bill that bingo machines be certified or locally licensed.

One of the intentions of the proposed law is to eliminate state licensure, therefore section 5(2) appears to be in conflict with the remainder of the proposal. 5. There will be 2,896 (full year) licensed video poker machines in Montana in FY88 and 2,925 (full year) in FY89 (Revised assumption based on FY87 licensing data).
6. Under the proposed law, the average license fee is $\$ 1,250$.
7. It is the intent of the proposed law that the Department of Revenue investigate and inspect certified poker machines. Expenditures for investigations and inspections would be $\$ 100,000$ per year (Investigations and Enforcement Division Estimate).
8. Under current law, for FY88 and FY89, administrative expenditures are $3 \%$ of total license fees.
9. Certification equipment: emulator @ $\$ 50,000$, other equipment @ $\$ 25,000$. (One time Expenses).
10. Certification would require 1 FTE (grade 16, step $2, \$ 26,716$ per year salary and benefits) and $1 / 2$ FTE (grade 7 , step 2 , $\$ 8,425$ salaries and benefits plus $20 \%$ allowed for operating expenses).
11. It is not the intent of this bill that bingo machines be certified or locally licensed.
