Creating a certification standards and practices advisory council allocated to the Board of Public Education; to provide a special revenue fund for the disposition of certification fees to cover the expenses of the council and the cost of issuing certificates.

The revenue generated from the certification fees under current law is deposited into the general fund. It 1. is assumed that half of this revenue is generated between April and June in each fiscal year,

Creating a certification standards and practices advisory council allocated to the Board of Public Education; to provide a special revenue fund for the disposition of certification fees to cover the expenses of the council and the cost of issuing certificates.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The revenue generated from the certification fees under current law is deposited into the general fund.

2. The number of teachers applying for certification will remain at the 1986 level.

3. Three half-time positions will be necessary for research, clerical and administrative support; .5 FTE grade 16 and .5 FTE grade 14, and .5 grade 9 position.
