

### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A joint resolution urging operation of ports of entry between Alberta, Canada and Montana on summer-hour schedules during the 1988 Olympics.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Assume summer hour operation for the Ports of Piegan, Sweetgrass, Chief Mountain, Del Bonita, Whitlash and Wildhorse border stations.
- 2. Department of Highways maintains roads to the Ports of Piegan, Sweetgrass, and Wildhorse.
