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absolutely vital to any recovery of the agricultural
 economy; and

3 WHEREAS, the Farm Credit System's regulator, the Farm 4 Credit Administration in Washington, D.C., has proven itself 5 incapable of or unwilling to take any action to alleviate 6 these problems but has contributed to the problem by tying 7 the system banks in red tape and burdening the system with 8 onerous and unnecessary regulations.

10 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE 11 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

12 That the Congress of the United States is urged to pass 13 legislation to restore confidence and competence in the Farm 14 Credit System by providing the necessary assistance to 15 restore its financial stability, provide lower, competitive 16 interest rates, restore the borrower stock lost in the 17 failed PCAs, and institute a guaranty of borrower stock in 18 the future so that this tragedy will never occur again.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State
send a copy of this resolution to each member of Montana's
Congressional Delegation and to the Director of the Farm
Credit Administration.
