4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO SUBMIT TO THE
5	QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF MONTANA AN AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE V,
6	SECTION 11, OF THE MONTANA CONSTITUTION TO PROVIDE THAT A
7	LEGISLATOR MAY NOT INTRODUCE MORE THAN FIVE BILLS IN A
8	LEGISLATIVE SESSION."

10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
11	Section 1. Article V, section 11, of The Constitution
12	of the State of Montana is amended to read:
13	"Section 11. Bills. (1) A law shall be passed by bill
14	which shall not be so altered or amended on its passage
15	through the legislature as to change its original purpose.
16	No bill shall become law except by a vote of the majority of
17	all members present and voting.
18	(2) Every vote of each member of the legislature on
19	each substantive question in the legislature, in any
20	committee, or in committee of the whole shall be recorded
21	and made public. On final passage, the vote shall be taken
22	by ayes and noes and the names entered on the journal.
23	[3] Each bill, except general appropriation bills and

25 shall contain only one subject, clearly expressed in its

1 title. If any subject is embraced in any act and is not 2 expressed in the title, only so much of the act not so 3 expressed is yoid.

4 (4) A general appropriation bill shall contain only 5 appropriations for the ordinary expenses of the legislative, 6 executive, and judicial branches, for interest on the public 7 debt, and for public schools. Every other appropriation 8 shall be made by a separate bill, containing but one 9 subject.

10 (5) No appropriation shall be made for religious, 11 charitable, industrial, educational, or benevolent purposes 12 to any private individual, private association, or private 13 corporation not under control of the state.

14 (6) A legislator may not introduce more than five
15 bills in a legislative session.

16 (6)(7) A law may be challenged on the ground of 17 noncompliance with this section only within two years after 18 its effective date."

19 Section 2. Submission to electorate. This amendment 20 shall be submitted to the qualified electors of Montana at 21 the general election to be held in November 1990 by printing 22 on the ballot the full title of this act and the following: 23 FOR limiting the number of bills a legislator may
