#### STATEMENT OF INTENT

A statement of intent is included with this bill to make clear the legislature's intent with regard to rules that must be adopted under the extension of authority included in {section 4} of the bill.

It is the intent of this bill to authorize attendance at the Montana law enforcement academy of qualified individuals who are not at the time employed as law enforcement officers. Attendance is intended to be on a space-available basis. Rules should be adopted to insure continued priority for the training of law enforcement officers. Rules should assure that law enforcement officer



- training would not be disrupted or displaced by the attendance of other qualified individuals.
- 3 It is the further intent of the legislature that all
- 4 costs of training are borne by the other qualified
- 5 individuals and not by the state of Montana. Should rules be
- 6 required to assure other qualified individuals bear the cost
- 7 of the training, including the establishment of an adequate
- 8 fee structure, it is the intent of the legislature that such
- 9 rules be adopted.
