DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A bill for an Act entitled: "An Act waiving state university and college tuition for survivors of firefighters or peace officers killed in the course of employment; and amending Section 20-25-421, MCA."

ASSUMPTIONS:

- One fee waiver is worth \$837 per year. 1.
- 2. Survivor would be a full-time student.
- At most, the number of survivors taking advantage of the tuition waiver would be one per year, or at most 3. two in any four year period.
