2 INTRODUCED BY Vincent

4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO ESTABLISH THE  
5 MONTANA VALUE-ADDED COMMISSION; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE  
6 EFFECTIVE DATE."  
7

8 WHEREAS, experts in economic development have  
9 emphasized that the State of Montana adds little value to  
10 the state's basic commodities before exportation; and

11 WHEREAS, adding value to products in Montana can create  
12 new jobs and increase profits.  
13

14 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

15 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Montana value-added  
16 commission. There is created the Montana value-added  
17 commission within the department of commerce.

18 NEW SECTION. Section 2. Purpose. It is the purpose of  
19 the Montana value-added commission to develop a strategy to  
20 add value, before exportation, to the state's basic  
21 commodities, including coal, metal and nonfuel minerals, oil  
22 and gas, timber, agriculture, tourism and travel, water, and  
23 wildlife, in an effort to create new jobs and increase  
24 profits.

25 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Commission members --

1 composition -- nomination -- appointment. (1) The Montana  
2 value-added commission consists of 10 members, including:

3 (a) nine members appointed from the following  
4 industries: wood products; oil and gas; coal mining; metal  
5 and nonfuel mineral mining; livestock, including cattle and  
6 sheep; grain producers; manufacturing; high technology; and  
7 tourism; and

8 (b) one member appointed from the university research  
9 and development programs within the university system.

10 (2) The director of the department of commerce shall  
11 request industry trade associations to nominate persons for  
12 appointment under subsection (1)(a). A trade association  
13 executive may be nominated and appointed and may serve on  
14 the commission.

15 (3) The appointee under subsection (1)(b) must be  
16 selected from among candidates nominated by the presidents  
17 of the university system units.

18 (4) After consultation with the president of the  
19 senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, and the  
20 leaders of the minority parties in the senate and the house  
21 of representatives, the director of the department of  
22 commerce shall appoint the members provided for in  
23 subsection (1) from the nominations presented under  
24 subsections (2) and (3).

25 NEW SECTION. Section 4. Codification instruction.

LC 0895/01

1 [Sections 1 through 3] are intended to be codified as an  
2 integral part of Title 2, chapter 15, part 18, and the  
3 provisions of Title 2, chapter 15, part 18, apply to  
4 [sections 1 through 3].

5 NEW SECTION. **Section 5.** Effective date. [This act] is  
6 effective on passage and approval.

6. Report published FY91.
7. Funding from General Fund.
