9 NEW SECTION. Section 1. Definition of electronic
 10 bulletin board. As used in [sections 2 and 3], "electronic

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB270, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:


An Act establishing an electronic bulletin board in each department of state government and providing an effective date.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The Department of Administration will provide and maintain a central electronic bulletin board for state government agencies to use as a means of conveying information to the citizens of Montana. Agencies involved in communicating information with the public will maintain appropriate information on the system. The establishment of this initial system will serve as a pilot project to encourage the practice of providing for direct citizen access to state computer information where that access is cost beneficial.
2. The Department of Administration will be responsible for the security and integrity of the bulletin board system. Each department will be responsible for the integrity and appropriateness of their information on the system.
3. The Department of Administration will be responsible for providing an equitable method of recovering the cost of operating the system.

LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Use of the system is likely to grow at a substantial rate by both agencies and the public. Each additional concurrent user would require approximately \$2,700 for equipment and \$270 each year for operating expenses, plus additional telephone costs and assigned staffed time.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Definition of electronic
bulletin board. As used in [sections 2 and 3], "electronic
bulletin board" means a remote database system containing
various types of information accessible by means of a
computer, a modem, and a telephone line.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Establishment. Each THE
department of state---government ADMINISTRATION shall
establish and maintain an, AS A PILOT PROJECT, A CENTRALIZED
electronic bulletin board SYSTEM FOR STATE AGENCIES TO USE
as a means of conveying information to the citizens of

Montana. AGENCIES INVOLVED IN COMMUNICATING INFORMATION TO
THE PUBLIC SHALL MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE INFORMATION ON THE
BULLETIN BOARD SYSTEM. THE PURPOSE OF THIS PILOT PROJECT IS
TO ENCOURAGE THE PRACTICE OF PROVIDING FOR DIRECT CITIZEN
ACCESS TO STATE COMPUTERIZED INFORMATION.

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Responsibilities. (1) The
department of administration shall:

(a) set standards for the selection of software for
the electronic bulletin boards; and

(b) determine procedures for bulletin board use.

(2) Each THE department OF ADMINISTRATION shall
provide security to protect the integrity of its electronic
bulletin board system. EACH DEPARTMENT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR
ENSURING THE INTEGRITY AND APPROPRIATENESS OF THE
INFORMATION THAT IT PLACES IN THE SYSTEM.

(3) THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION SHALL PROVIDE FOR
AN EQUITABLE METHOD FOR RECOVERING THE COST OF OPERATING THE
ELECTRONIC BULLETIN BOARD SYSTEM.

NEW SECTION. SECTION 4. REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE.
THE DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATION SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO
THE 52ND LEGISLATURE THAT EVALUATES THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE
CENTRALIZED ELECTRONIC BULLETIN BOARD SYSTEM, PROVIDES A
COST ANALYSIS OF THE SYSTEM, AND PRESENTS RECOMMENDATIONS
FOR IMPROVING OR ENHANCING THE SYSTEM.
