A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT TO EXEMPT SAILBOARD USERS 12 YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER FROM THE REQUIREMENTS REGARDING LIFE PRESERVERS; CLARIFYING OPERATING PROCEDURES FOR SAILBOARDS; AND AMENDING SECTIONS 23-2-521, 23-2-523, AND 23-2-524, MCA."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 23-2-521, MCA, is amended to read:

"23-2-521. Equipment. (1) Every motorboat or vessel
shall have aboard:

- (a) one United States coast guard approved personal flotation device in good and serviceable condition for each person on board, provided that any person who has not reached his 12th birthday shall have a United States coast guard approved life preserver properly fastened to his person when occupying a motorboat or vessel under 26 feet in length while such motorboat or vessel is in motion:
- (b) if carrying or using any inflammable or toxic fluid in any enclosure for any purpose and if the motorboat or vessel is not an entirely open one, an efficient natural or mechanical ventilation system prescribed by the department which shall be used and be capable of removing

resulting gases prior to and during the time the motorboat or vessel is occupied by a person;

- (c) hand portable fire extinguishers approved by the United States coast guard, the number of which is to be determined by the department, or a United States coast guard approved fixed fire extinguishing system, except that motorboats less than 26 feet in length of entirely open construction, propelled by outboard motors, and not carrying passengers for hire need not carry such portable fire extinguishers or fire extinguishing systems.
- 11 (2) Every motorboat or vessel shall have the
  12 carburetor or carburetors of every engine therein (except
  13 outboard motors) using gasoline as fuel equipped with an
  14 efficient flame arrester, backfire trap, or other similar
  15 device.
  - (3) (a) Except as provided in subsection (3)(b), the exhaust of every internal combustion engine used on a motorboat or vessel must be muffled either by discharge underwater or by a functioning muffler capable of muffling exhaust noise at full throttle to 86 dbA or less when measured at a distance of 50 feet. The muffler may not be modified or altered, such as by a cutout. The department may require a test at dockside to determine exhaust noise level.
    - (b) The provisions of subsection (3)(a) do not apply to a motorboat:

- 1 (i) competing in a state-sanctioned regatta or boat
  2 race while on trial runs between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. and
  3 during a period not more than 48 hours immediately preceding
  4 the regatta or boat race; or
- 5 (ii) operating under a separate permit issued by the 6 department for the purpose of tuning engines, making test or 7 trial runs, or competing in official trials for speed 8 records other than in connection with regattas or boat 9 races.
- 10 (4) (a) Except as provided in subsection (4)(b), no
  11 vessel may be equipped with a siren, and no person may use
  12 or install a siren on a vessel.

- (b) An authorized emergency vessel may be equipped with a siren capable of sound audible under normal conditions from a distance of not less than 500 feet, but the siren may be used only when the vessel is operated in response to an emergency call or in the immediate pursuit of an actual or suspected violator of the law, and the operator of the vessel shall sound the siren when necessary to warn persons of the vessel's approach.
- 21 (5) When in operation or at anchor or moored away from 22 a docking facility between sunset and sunrise, all vessels 23 shall display lights as prescribed by the department.
- 24 (6) The department may designate waters where and the 25 time of year on these waters when all persons aboard a

- motorboat or vessel must wear approved life preservers at all times.
- 3 (7) Vessels, including houseboats and floating cabins,
  4 equipped with a galley or toilet shall have a wastewater
  5 holding system sealed to prevent the discharge of
  6 water-carried waste products, whether treated or untreated,
  7 into the surrounding waters.
  - (8) The department may adopt rules modifying the equipment requirements contained in this section to the extent necessary to keep these requirements in conformity with the provisions of the federal navigation and safety laws or with the navigation and safety rules promulgated by the United States coast guard.
- 14 (9) A person may not operate or give permission for 15 the operation of a vessel which is not equipped as required 16 by this section.
- (10) The provisions of subsection (1)(a) do not apply 17 to a person who operates a sailboard, as the term is 18 commonly understood, whether with or without attached sails. 19 For purposes of subsection (1)(a), a sailboard is considered 20 21 a personal flotation device; therefore, no additional requirements for flotation devices or wearing apparel are 22 prescribed. However, a person who has not reached his 12th 23 birthday shall have a United States coast quard approved 24 life preserver properly fastened to his person when 25

## occupying a sailboard."

- Section 2. Section 23-2-523, MCA, is amended to read:

  - (2) No person may operate any motorboat, including a sailboat propelled by a motor of any kind, or manipulate any water skis, surfboard, or similar device attached to a motorboat while under the influence of alcohol or drugs.
  - (3) It is unlawful for the owner of any motorboat or vessel or any person having such in charge or in control to authorize or knowingly permit the same to be operated by any person who by reason of physical or mental disability is incapable of operating such watercraft under the prevailing circumstances.
  - (4) No person may operate or knowingly permit any person to operate any motorboat or vessel at a rate of speed greater than will permit such person, in the exercise of reasonable care, to bring the vessel to a stop within the assured clear distance ahead. However, nothing in this part is intended to prevent the operator of a vessel actually competing in a regatta which is sanctioned by an appropriate

- governmental unit from attempting to attain high speeds on a marked racing course.
- 3 (5) No person may make a reckless approach to,
  4 departure from, or passage by a dock, ramp, diving board, or
  5 float.
  - (6) Skiers being pulled by motorboats must have on their person a life preserver, buoyant vest, or ski belt.
  - (7) No person may moor a vessel to any of the buoys or beacons placed in any waters of this state by the authority of the United States, an agency of the United States, or the department or in any manner hang on with a vessel to such buoy or beacon, except in the act of maintenance work on such buoy or beacon, nor may any person deface, remove, or destroy any such buoy, beacon, or other authorized navigational marker maintained in the waters of this state.
  - (8) A person who operates a sailboard is exempt from the use of personal flotation devices, except as specified in 23-2-521(10).
  - t8)(9) If an officer whose duty it is to enforce the sections of this law observes a vessel being used without sufficient lifesaving or firefighting devices or in an overloaded or other unsafe condition and in his judgment such use creates an especially hazardous condition, he may direct the operator to take whatever immediate and reasonable steps would be necessary for the safety of those

- 1 aboard the vessel, including directing the operator to
- 2 return to mooring or launching site and to remain there
  - until the situation creating the hazard is corrected or
- 4 ended."

- 5 Section 3. Section 23-2-524, MCA, is amended to read:
- 6 "23-2-524. Passing rule and right-of-way. (1) When two
- 7 vessels are approaching each other "head on" or nearly so
  - (so as to involve risk of collision), each vessel shall bear
- 9 to the right and pass the other vessel on its left side.
- 10 (2) When vessels approach each other obliquely or at
- 11 right angles, the vessel approaching on the right side has
- if fight angles, the vesser approaching on the right side has
- 12 the right-of-way.
- 13 (3) One vessel may overtake another on either side but
- 14 shall grant right-of-way to the overtaken vessel.
- 15 (4) When a sailboat or sailboard and motorboat are
- operating as to involve a risk of collision with each other,
- 17 the motorboat shall yield the right-of-way to the sailboat
- 18 or sailboard in all cases."
- 19 NEW SECTION. Section 4. Extension of authority. Any
- 20 existing authority to make rules on the subject of the
- 21 provisions of [this act] is extended to the provisions of
- 22 [this act].
