4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REQUIRING SERVICE 5 STATIONS TO PROVIDE A REFUELING SERVICE AT A SELF-SERVICE 6 ISLAND AT SELF-SERVICE PRICE TO DISABLED DRIVERS; REQUIRING 7 THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE TO PLACE A DISABILITY CODE ON THE 8 DRIVER'S LICENSE OF A DISABLED DRIVER; AND PROVIDING AN 9 EFFECTIVE DATE."

11 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 1. Definitions. As used in 13 [sections 2 and 3], the following definitions apply:

(1) "Disabled" means a person who is unable to walk
unassisted by another person or without the aid of a walker,
crutches, or a brace or prosthetic device or is confined to
a wheelchair.

18 (2) "Service station" means a facility with full
19 service and self-service islands that offers gasoline or
20 other motor vehicle fuels for retail sale to the public.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Service station refueling
 service for disabled persons -- notice -- exceptions.
 (1) (a) Upon request, an attendant on duty at a service
 station shall dispense motor fuel to a disabled driver of a
 vehicle, who is unaccompanied by a physically able person



and whose driver's license displays a disability code
 provided under [section 3].

3 (b) The attendant shall charge the driver a price no
4 greater than that offered to the general public for motor
5 fuel dispensed at the self-service island.

6 (2) Each person licensed to do business under 7 15-70-202 or 15-70-203 shall post in his service station a 8 notice regarding this service to disabled persons. The 9 notice must be displayed in a manner that is conspicuous to 10 all drivers.

(3) The department of revenue shall provide a notice
 setting forth the provisions of this section to each person
 licensed to do business under 15-70-202 or 15-70-203.

14 (4) The department of justice shall publicize the
15 provisions of [sections 1 through 3] in a manner designed to
16 inform those eligible for the refueling service.

17 (5) The provisions of this section do not apply to 18 service stations with only self-service islands, nor do they 19 apply to any services other than the dispensing of motor 20 fuel.

21 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 3. Disability code on driver's 22 license -- requirements -- replacement license. (1) The 23 department shall provide on each driver's license a space to 24 indicate whether the licensee is entitled to the refueling 25 service provided in [section 2]. INTRODUCED BILL

1 (2) At the time of application for a new driver's 2 license or for a renewal, a licensee who wishes to be 3 eligible for the refueling service shall submit to the 4 department a certificate from a licensed physician that 5 describes the applicant as disabled according to the 6 definition in [section 1].

7 (3) The department shall place a disability code on
8 the driver's license of an applicant who submits a
9 certificate as provided in subsection (2).

10 (4) A disabled person currently holding a valid 11 driver's license on [the effective date of this act] may 12 apply for a replacement license that bears the disability 13 code. The replacement license is exempt from the \$5 fee 14 required by 61-5-114.

15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 4. Extension of authority. Any 16 existing authority to make rules on the subject of the 17 provisions of [this act] is extended to the provisions of 18 [this act].

NEW SECTION. Section 5. Codification instruction. (1)
[Sections 1 and 2] are intended to be codified as an
integral part of Title 49, chapter 4, and the provisions of
Title 49, chapter 4, apply to [sections 1 and 2].

23 (2) [Section 3] is intended to be codified as an
24 integral part of Title 61, chapter 5, part 1, and the
25 provisions of Title 61, chapter 5, part 1, apply to [section

1 3].

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB303, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An Act requiring service stations to provide a refueling service at a self-service island at self-service price to disabled drivers; requiring the Department of Justice to place a disability code on the driver's license of a disabled driver; and providing an effective date.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. There are 3,300 license plates issued for disabled persons and 9,800 disabled person parking permits. It is assumed 2,000 persons will apply for a replacement driver's license.

2. Assumed that 10,000 announcement letters will be mailed at a cost of \$0.50 per letter.
