11	Section 1. Section 41-3-108, MCA, is amended to read:
12	"41-3-108. Child protective teams. The county attorney
13	or the department of family services may convene one or more
14	temporary or permanent interdisciplinary child protective
15	teams. These teams may assist in assessing the needs of,
16	formulating and monitoring a treatment plan for, and
17	coordinating services to the child and his family. The
18	supervisor of child protective services in a local service
19	area or his designee shall serve as the team's coordinator.
20	Members shall include:
21	(a) a social worker;
22	(b) a member of a local law enforcement agency;
23	(c) a representative of the medical profession,-and;
24	(d) a county attorney; and
25	(a) if the child is an Indian comeone preferably as

1	Indian person, knowledgeable about Indian culture and family
2	matters."
3	Section 2. Section 41-5-525, MCA, is amended to read:
4	"41-5-525. Youth placement committees composition.
5	(1) In each judicial district, the department shall
6	establish a youth placement committee for the purposes of
7	recommending an appropriate placement of a youth referred to
8	the department under 41-5-403 or committed to the departmen
9	under 41-5-523.
10	(2) The committee consists of not less than five
11	members, appointed by the department, and must include:
12	$\underline{(a)}$ a representative of the department;
13	(b) a representative of a county department of publi
14	welfare7 <u>;</u>
15	<pre>(c) a youth probation officer7;</pre>
16	<pre>(d) a mental health professional;</pre>
17	(e) a representative of a school district locate
18	within the boundaries of the judicial district; and
19	(f) someone, preferably an Indian person
20	knowledgeable about Indian culture and family matters.
