NEW SECTION. Section 1. Definitions. As used in [this 10 act). "committee" means the committee on state employee 11 compensation created in [section 2]. 12

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Committee on state employee 13 compensation -- composition and appointment. (1) There is a 14 15 committee on state employee compensation.

- (2) The governor shall appoint nine members to the committee. Two of the members must be representatives of employee organizations and have knowledge of or experience in negotiating the pay schedules provided in 2-18-312 through 2-18-315.
- NEW SECTION. Section 3. Term of office -- vacancies. 21
- (1) A committee member shall serve until the committee 22 23
- terminates as provided in [section 7].
- (2) A vacancy on the committee must be filled in the 24 25 same manner as the original appointment.

- (2) The committee shall meet upon the call of the 4 chairman or at the request of five members. 5
- (3) Five members constitute a quorum to transact 6 7 business.
- (4) A member is entitled to compensation as provided 8 in 2-15-122(5).
- NEW SECTION. Section 5. Duties of the committee. The 10 11 committee shall:
- policies governing state 12 (1) examine employee 13 compensation in Montana;
- (2) study compensation policies of other comparable 14 15 governmental and private sector entities;
- 16 (3) review professional literature and research on 17 compensation issues:
- 18 (4) analyze and assess various components of the 19 Montana state employee compensation system;
- 20 (5) identify problems with the state employee 21 compensation system and options for resolving these 22 problems. State employees and managers may be surveyed to assist in identifying these problems and options. 23
- 24 (6) develop recommendations to maximize employee 25 productivity and promote quality governmental services

- 1 within available funding; and
- 2 (7) report its findings, recommendations, and any
- 3 proposed legislation to the governor and the 52nd
- 4 legislature.
- 5 NEW SECTION. Section 6. Staff assistance. The state
- 6 personnel division, department of administration, shall
- 7 provide staff assistance to the committee.
- 8 NEW SECTION. Section 7. Termination. The committee
- 9 terminates July 1, 1991.
- 10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 8. Appropriation. There is
- appropriated \$90,000 to the department of administration for
- the biennium ending June 30, 1991, for use by the committee.
- 13 These funds may be used for contracted services, salary and
- 14 benefits for temporary staff, compensation for committee
- 15 members, and other necessary expenses incurred by the
- 16 committee in performing its duties as provided in [section
- 17 5].
- 18 NEW SECTION. Section 9. Effective date. [This act] is
- 19 effective July 1, 1989.
