Section 17-7-401, MCA, is amended to read: 13 "17-7-401. Definitions. As used in this part, the 14 following definitions apply: 15 (1) "Additional services" means different services or 16 more of the same services. 17 (2) "Agency" means each state office, department, 18 division. board. commission, council. committee. 19 institution, university unit, or other entity or

20 instrumentality of the executive branch, office of the 21 judicial branch, or office of the legislative branch of 22 state government.

23 (3) "Approving authority" means the governor or his
24 designated representative for executive branch agencies, the
25 chief justice of the supreme court or his designated

representative for judicial branch agencies, appropriate
 legislative committees or a designated representative for
 legislative branch agencies, or the board of regents or its
 designated representative for the university system.

amendment" 5 (4) "Budget means а legislative appropriation to increase spending authority for the special 6 revenue fund, proprietary funds, or unrestricted subfund, 7 8 or, for fire suppression costs of the department of state 9 lands, the general fund, contingent in all cases on total 10 compliance with all budget amendment procedures.

(5) "Emergency" means any catastrophe, disaster, 11 calamity, or other serious unforeseen and unanticipated 12 circumstance that has occurred subsequent to the time an 13 14 agency's appropriation was made, which was clearly not 15 within the contemplation of the legislature and the 16 governor, and which seriously affects one or more functions 17 of a state agency and the agency's expenditure requirements 18 for the performance of the function or functions.

19 (6) "Executive branch approving authority" means the20 governor or his designated representative.

(7) "Necessary" means essential to the public welfare
and of a nature which cannot wait until the next legislative
session for legislative consideration.

24 (8) "Requesting agency" means the agency of state25 government that has requested a specific budget amendment.

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1 (9) "University system unit" means the board of 2 regents, office of the commissioner of higher education, 3 university of Montana at Missoula, Montana state university 4 at Bozeman. Montana college of mineral science and 5 technology at Butte, eastern Montana college at Billings, 6 northern Montana college at Havre, western Montana college 7 at Dillon, the agricultural experiment station with central 8 offices at Bozeman, the forestry and conservation experiment 9 station with central offices at Missoula, the cooperative extension service with central offices at Bozeman, or the 10 11 bureau of mines and geology with central offices at Butte." Section 2. Section 17-7-402, MCA, is amended to read: 12 13 "17-7-402. Budget amendment requirements. (1) No 14 Except as provided in subsection (4), no budget amendment may be approved: 15

16 (a) by the approving authority, except a budget
17 amendment to spend funds which were not available for
18 legislative consideration;

(b) by the approving authority, which contains any
significant ascertainable commitment for any present or
future increased general fund support;

(c) by the approving authority, for the expenditure of
money in the state special revenue fund unless an emergency
justifies such expenditure;

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2 (e) by the approving authority, for any matter of 3 which the requesting agency had knowledge at a time when the 4 proposal could have been presented to an appropriation 5 subcommittee, the house appropriations committee, or the 6 senate finance and claims committee of the most recent 7 legislative session open to that matter; or

8 (f) to extend beyond June 30 of the last year of any9 biennium.

10 (2) All budget amendments shall itemize planned 11 expenditures by fiscal year.

12 (3) Each budget amendment must be submitted by the
13 approving authority to the budget director and the office of
14 the legislative fiscal analyst.

15 (4) The approving authority may approve a budget amendment from the general fund to pay the reasonable and necessary fire suppression costs and expenses incurred by the department of state lands."

19 Section 3. Section 17-7-403, MCA, is amended to read:
20 "17-7-403. Budget amendment certification. In
21 approving a budget amendment, the approving authority shall
22 make the following certifications and in addition shall
23 provide all other information required below as an integral
24 part of the certification:

(1) The approving authority shall certify that:

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(d) by the approving authority, unless it will provide

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(a) specific additional services will be provided as a
 result of the expenditures to be permitted under this budget
 amendment and shall also list each specific service to be so
 provided;

5 (b) the specific services to be provided under this
6 budget amendment are necessary;

7 (c) the agency requesting this budget amendment has no 8 other reasonable alternative available to provide the 9 additional services. Such The certification shall 10 specifically include determinations by the approving authority that the agency cannot provide all or specific 11 12 parts or amounts of the additional services with existing 13 personnel because of the present required workload of 14 existing personnel or that the agency is unable within its 15 existing funding to fund all or part of such the additional 16 services from any source lawfully available to it.

(d) except as authorized in 17-7-402(4), the budget 17 amendment makes no ascertainable present or future 18 19 significant commitment for increased general fund support. 20 (2) The approving authority shall include in its 21 certification the specific criteria by which the 22 effectiveness of the additional services will be evaluated 23 and shall state a specific followup date on which the 24 written evaluation of such the services, using the listed 25 criteria, will be presented to the legislative fiscal analyst. The written evaluation must be presented to the
 legislative fiscal analyst on or before that date.

3 (3) For budget amendments to spend money in the state 4 special revenue fund, the approving authority shall certify 5 that an emergency justifies the expenditure and shall state 6 the specific nature of the emergency, the date on which the 7 requesting agency became aware of the emergency, and the 8 manner in which the requesting agency became aware of the 9 emergency."
