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
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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Consolidation of fire districts. (1) Two or more rural fire districts may consolidate to form a single rural fire district upon an affirmative vote of each rural fire district's board of trustees. At the time they vote to consolidate, the boards of trustees must also adopt a consolidation plan. The plan must contain:

- (a) a timetable for consolidation, including the effective date of consolidation, which must be after the time allowed for protests to the creation of the consolidated rural fire district under subsection (3);
 - (b) the name of the new rural fire district:
 - (c) a boundary map of the new rural fire district; and
- 22 (d) the estimated financial impact of consolidation on 23 the average taxpayer within the proposed district.
- 24 (2) Within 14 days of the date that the trustees vote 25 to consolidate, notice of the consolidation must be
