## DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

HB417 would allow the sale of alcoholic beverages to passengers on tour boats that are at least 40 feet in length and equipped to carry at least 50 passengers by holders of a resort all-beverages license who receive endorsement. This legislation also provides conditions under which the endorsement can be issued and a fee.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The Department of Fish, Wildife and Parks or the U. S. Coast Guard are currently inspecting all tour boats at least annually for proper safety equipment. Consequently, passage of this legislation would not have any fiscal impact on the Dept. of Fish, Wildlife and Parks.
2. The Department of Revenue assumes that passage of this legislation would have no fiscal impact on the department expenditures and only minimal impact on the revenue from liquor licenses.

FISCAL IMPACT: None
EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUE OR EXPENDITURES:
This legislation may result in some revenue increase for the few vendors in Montana who are providing tour boat services.
