4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ALLOWING A COUNTY WATER 5 OR SEWER DISTRICT THAT WAS FORMED FROM A PRIVATE, NONPROFIT 6 WATER ASSOCIATION TO ACQUIRE PROPERTY FROM THE ASSOCIATION 7 BY EMINENT DOMAIN; AMENDING SECTION 7-13-2218, MCA; AND 8 PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 7-13-2218, MCA, is amended to read: "7-13-2218. District powers related to water and sewer projects. Any district incorporated as provided in this part shall-have-power-to may:

(1) construct, purchase, lease, or otherwise acquire 15 and operate and maintain water rights, waterworks, sanitary 16 sewerworks, storm sewerworks, canals, conduits, reservoirs, 17 lands, and rights useful or necessary to store, conserve, 18 supply, produce, convey, or drain water or sewage for 19 20 purposes beneficial to the district -- such. Beneficial purposes to include but are not be limited to flood 21 prevention, flood control, irrigation, drainage, municipal 22 and industrial water supplies, domestic water supplies, 23 wildlife, recreation, pollution abatement, livestock water 24 supply, and other similar purposes;. 25

1 (2) if the incorporators of the district are members 2 of a private, nonprofit water association that was formed 3 under the laws of this state, acquire by eminent domain from 4 that water association any type of property referred to in 5 this section;

6 (2) store water for the benefit of the district: 7 conserve water for future use; appropriate, acquire, and 8 conserve water and water rights for the purposes of the 9 district; commence, maintain, intervene in, and compromise, 10 in the name of the district, and assume the costs of any 11 action or proceeding involving or affecting the ownership or 12 use of waters, water rights, or sewer rights within the district used or useful for any purpose of the district or a 13 14 benefit to any land situated therein in the district;

15 (3)(4) commence, maintain, intervene in, defend, and 16 compromise actions and proceedings to prevent interference 17 with or diminution of the natural flow of any stream or 18 natural subterranean supply of waters used or useful for any 19 purpose of the district or a common benefit to the lands 20 within the district or its inhabitants;

(4)(5) commence, maintain, and defend actions and
proceedings to prevent any interference with the aforesaid
waters or rights referred to in this section as may endanger
the inhabitants or lands of the district;

25 (5)(6) lease of-and from any person, firm, or public

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or private corporation, with the privilege of purchase or
 otherwise, existing water rights, waterworks, sewerworks,
 canals, or reservoir systems; and carry on and maintain the
 same them;

5 (6)(7) sell water or the use thereof of water for 6 household or domestic use or other similar purposes and, 7 whenever there is a surplus of water, sell or otherwise 8 dispose of the same water to municipalities or towns or to 9 consumers located within or without <u>outside</u> the boundaries 10 of the district."

11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 2. Effective date. [This act] is 12 effective on passage and approval.
