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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 20-10-111, MCA, is amended to read:

"20-10-111. Duties of board of public education. (1) The board of public education, by-and with the advice of the Montana department of justice and the superintendent of public instruction, shall adopt and enforce policies, not inconsistent with the motor vehicle laws, to provide uniform standards and regulations for the design, construction, and operation of school buses in the state of Montana. Such policies shall:

- (a) prescribe minimum standards for the design and construction of school buses not inconsistent with:
- (i) minimum standards adopted by the national commission on safety education; or
- (ii) minimum standards adopted by the national highway
  safety bureau;
