Section 61-6-303, MCA, is amended to read: 12 13 "61-6-303. Exempt vehicles. The following vehicles and their drivers are exempt from the provisions of 61-6-301: 14 (1) a vehicle owned by the United States government or 15 any state or political subdivision; 16 (2) a vehicle for which cash, securities, or a bond 17 has been deposited or filed with the department upon such 18 terms and conditions providing the same benefits available 19 under a required motor vehicle liability insurance policy; 20 (3) a vehicle owned by a self-insurer certified as 21 provided in 61-6-143; 22 (4) an implement of husbandry or special mobile 23 equipment that is only incidentally operated on a highway or 24 property open to use by the public; 25 itana Legislative Council

1 (5) a vehicle operated upon a highway only for the 2 purpose of crossing such highway from one property to 3 another;

4 (6) a commercial vehicle registered or proportionally 5 registered in this and any other jurisdiction, provided that 6 vehicle is covered by a motor vehicle liability insurance 7 policy complying with the laws of another jurisdiction in 8 which it is registered;

9 (7) a motorcycle or quadricycle not operated on a
10 public highway as defined in 61-1-202;

(8) a vehicle moved solely by human or animal power;
(9) a vehicle owned by a nonresident if it is
currently registered in the owner's resident jurisdiction
and he is in compliance with the motor vehicle liability
insurance requirements, if any, of that jurisdiction."

16 Section 2. Section 61-9-417, MCA, is amended to read:

17 "61-9-417. Headgear required for minor motorcycle or guadricycle riders. An The operator and passenger under-i8 years-of-age of any motorcycle or quadricycle operated upon the streets or highways of this state shall wear protective headgear upon the head. The headgear shall must meet standards established by the department of justice."

23 Section 3. Section 61-9-518, MCA, is amended to read:
24 "61-9-518. Violation of motorcycle or quadricycle
25 requirements -- penalty. (1) A person convicted of the

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violation of 61-9-417 shall-be-fined-\$5;

(2)--A-person-convicted-of-the-violation-of or 61-9-418 2 shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$10 or more 3 than \$100 or by imprisonment for not more than 10 days or by 4 both such fine and imprisonment for the first such 5 conviction. For a second conviction within 1 year 6 7 thereafter, such person shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$25 or more than \$200 or by imprisonment for not 8 9 more than 20 days or by both such fine and imprisonment. 10 Upon a third or subsequent conviction within 1 year after 11 the first conviction, such person shall be punished by a 12 fine of not less than \$50 or more than \$500 or by 13 imprisonment for not more than 6 months or by both such fine 14 and imprisonment."

15 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 4. Extension of authority. Any 16 existing authority to make rules on the subject of the 17 provisions of [this act] is extended to the provisions of 18 [this act].
