NEW SECTION. Section 2. State veterans' home in eastern Montana established. A state home for veterans is established in eastern Montana at a site to be determined by the site selection committee as provided in [section 3].

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Site selection committee. (1)

The governor shall, by August 1, 1989, appoint a committee to select a site for a state veterans' home in eastern Montana.

(2) The committee shall consist of seven honorably discharged veterans of the United States armed forces whose primary residence is in eastern Montana, as defined in [section 1]. There may be no more than one committee member from each county referred to in [section 1].

(3) The committee shall:

(a) evaluate the need and appropriateness of locatinga state veterans' home in eastern Montana;

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(b) establish objective criteria in compliance with federal law for the selection of the most favorable site in eastern Montana for a state veterans' home;

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- (c) establish criteria that comply with state health requirements;
- (d) solicit proposals from communities interested in becoming the location for the state veterans' home;
- (e) organize and conduct public hearings in each of the interested communities for the purpose of gathering input and information; and
- 11 (f) prepare and forward its recommendation on the most 12 favorable location for the state veterans' home to the 13 governor no later than October 31, 1990.
 - (4) The recommendation of the committee must be presented to the 52nd legislature and is binding unless overturned by a two-thirds vote of each house.
 - NEW SECTION. Section 4. Duties of department. The department of administration shall:
- 19 (1) direct its architecture and engineering division 20 to prepare a long-range building plan for this project 21 pursuant to 17-7-202; and
- 22 (2) carry out duties necessary to begin planning and 23 constructing a state home for veterans in eastern Montana, 24 including but not limited to arrangements for the approval 25 of bonds necessary to fulfill the state's financial

1 obligations for construction of the project.

NEW SECTION. Section 5. Authorization of bonds. The board is authorized, pursuant to 17-5-402, to issue and sell long-range building program bonds in an amount not to exceed \$1.4 million or in an amount as may be required to provide funds for the payment of up to 35% of the total \$4 million planning and construction costs of a state home for veterans in eastern Montana. The authority contained in this section is in addition to any other authorization to the board to issue long-range building program bonds.

NEW SECTION. Section 6. Authorization for refunding 11 bonds. The board is authorized to issue and sell refunding 12 bonds in an amount necessary to refund any or all long-range 13 building program bonds issued under 17-5-402. The refunding 14 bonds must be issued in accordance with the terms and in the 15 manner required by Title 17, chapter 5, part 3. The 16 refunding bonds must be general obligations secured by a 17 pledge of the full faith and credit and taxing powers of the 18 state. Any money released from the sinking fund account 19 provided for in 17-5-405 as a result of the issuance of 20 refunding bonds must revert to the fund of origin to the 21 extent not required to provide for the debt service on the 22 refunded bonds. Money required for payment of debt service 23 on the refunded bonds may be held in trust in a special 24 escrow account at a bank or trust company for the benefit of 25

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1 the refunded bonds.

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NEW SECTION. Section 7. Agreement with the department 2 of institutions. If the proceeds of any bonds or notes 3 issued pursuant to [section 5] are appropriated for the 4 5 purpose of planning or constructing a state veterans' home in eastern Montana, the board and the department of 6 institutions shall enter into an agreement pursuant to which 7 the department of institutions shall agree to pay to the state treasurer for deposit in the debt service account 10 established pursuant to 17-5-405 amounts sufficient to pay, as due, the principal of and interest on those bonds from 11 which the appropriation was made and to accumulate and 12 maintain the required reserve attributable to those bonds. 13 14 The agreement must provide that income from the investment of bond proceeds and the reserves not required for planning 15 or construction costs must be credited against the 16 department's payment obligation. The agreement must also 17 allow for the accumulation of reserves during the first year 18 19 the bonds are outstanding. Payments by the department must be made from funds available therefor. 20

NEW SECTION. Section 8. Benefit of state. The agreement made pursuant to [section 7] is solely for the benefit of the state of Montana and is not enforceable by bondholders or other third-party beneficiaries.

construction grant assistance. Upon approval of the project
by the veterans' administration and an authorization by the
state to provide up to 35% of the total planning and
construction costs, the department of institutions, pursuant

exceed 65% of the total planning and construction costs for
a state home for veterans in eastern Montana.

9 NEW SECTION. Section 10. Contingent revolving fund 10 established — fiscal officer designated. (1) The department 11 of administration shall establish a contingent revolving 12 account, pursuant to 17-2-201, for the general 13 administration of federal, state, and other funds accrued 14 for the purpose of constructing and planning a state home 15 for veterans in eastern Montana.

(2) The state treasurer is designated, pursuant to 17-3-106, as the fiscal officer of the state to receive and administer any and all construction grant money as approved by the veterans' administration for this project.

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for <u>HB547</u>, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A bill for an act entitled: "An act establishing a state Home for Veterans, not to exceed 100 beds, in Eastern Montana; authorizing the Board of Examiners to issue and sell no more than 1.4 million in Long-Range Building Program bonds for planning and construction, providing for an agreement between the Board of Examiners and the Department of Institutions ensuring adequate general fund support for future operations; authorizing the Department of Administration to create the necessary accounts for the administration of all state, federal, and other funds for its construction and operation; authorizing the Department of Institutions to apply for federal assistance grants.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Assume that the \$1,400,000 in principal authorized project expenditure would be a continuing appropriation.
- 2. Assume committee would be required to meet seven (7) times in FY90 and one (1) time in FY91.
- 3. Assume that seven (7) members of the proposed committee would have to travel for meetings and hearings and would receive travel, meals, lodging and salary of \$25/day/committee member.
- 4. Committee would hold seven (7) hearings in fiscal year 1991.
- 5. Assume an average trip of 350 miles requiring an overnight stay.
- 6. Assume that committee will need a part-time secretary and a minimal office with a telephone, desk, file cabinet, chair, word processor, supplies and postage.
- 7. Assume no additional personnel would be needed by the Department of Institutions or the Department of Administration.
- 8. Assume the part-time secretary would tape and type hearing minutes.
- 9. Assume construction and occupancy in the 92-93 biennium.
- 10. Allows a bond issue to finance the construction costs and assumes the Department of Institutions will pay back the principle and interest on the bonds.
- 11. The home will need to be operated on General Fund which would then allow the reimbursement received by the home to be used to pay back the bond debt account.

- (B) THE COMMITTEE'S EXPENSES MUST BE PAID BY THE MONTANA BOARD OF VETERANS' AFFAIRS.
