A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT APPROPRIATING MONEY TO THE DEPARTMENT OF FISH, WILDLIFE, AND PARKS TO BE USED TO MATCH MONEY OBTAINED FROM OTHER SOURCES TO ORGANIZE,

8 SLED DOG RACE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

PROMOTE. AND CONDUCT THE MONTANA GOVERNOR'S CUP 500-MILE

WHEREAS, the Montana Governor's Cup 500-Mile Sled Dog
Race has drawn national and international media attention to
the state and presents a significant opportunity to enhance
tourism and economic development; and

WHEREAS, other states provide strong financial support for sled dog racing events within those states.

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Appropriation. (1) There is appropriated from the account established by 15-65-121(1)(c)(i) in the state special revenue fund \$40,000 of the lodging facility use tax proceeds to the department of fish, wildlife, and parks for the biennium ending June 30, 1991, for the purpose of providing grants to match money raised from other sources, which money is to be used exclusively to organize, promote, and conduct the Montana governor's cup 500-mile sled dog race.



(2) The department of fish, wildlife, and parks shall administer the grants in conjunction with the snowmobile trail grooming program operated by the department. Grants may be made on an equal matching basis and must be used exclusively to organize, promote, and conduct the race, including the award of prizes to contestants.
