Section 37-3-102, MCA, is amended to read: 10 "37-3-102. Definitions. (1) Unless the context 11 requires otherwise, in this chapter the following 12 definitions apply; (a) "Practice of medicine" means the diagnosis, 13 14 treatment, or correction of or the attempt to or the holding 15 of oneself out as being able to diagnose, treat, or correct 16 human conditions. ailments, diseases, injuries, or 17 infirmities, whether physical or mental, including the 18 management of pregnancy or parturition, by any means, 19 methods, devices, or instrumentalities. If a person who does 20 not possess a license to practice medicine in this state 21 under this chapter and who is not exempt from the licensing 22 requirements of this chapter performs acts constituting the 23 practice of medicine, he is practicing medicine in violation 24 of this chapter.

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(b) "Board" means the Montana state board of medical

2 (c) "Department" means the department of commerce3 provided for in Title 2, chapter 15, part 18.

(2) An "approved medical school" is a school which 4 either is accredited by the American osteopathic association 5 6 or conforms to the minimum education standards established by the council on medical education of the American medical 7 8 association or successors for medical schools or is equivalent in the sound discretion of the board. The board 9 may, on investigation of the education standards 10 and facilities, approve any medical school, including foreign 11 12 medical schools.

(3) An "approved internship" is an internship training 13 14 program of at least 1 year in a hospital which is either approved for intern training by the American osteopathic 15 association or conforms to the minimum standards for intern 16 training established by the council on medical education of 17 the American medical association or successors. However, the 18 board shall have the authority, upon investigation, to 19 20 approve any other internship.

(4) An "approved residency" is a residency training
program in a hospital conforming to the minimum standards
for residency training established by the council on medical
education of the American medical association or successors
or approved for residency training by the American

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1 osteopathic association. However, the board shall have the 2 authority upon investigation to approve any other 3 residency."

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Section 2. Extension of authority. Any
existing authority to make rules on the subject of the
provisions of [this act] is extended to the provisions of
[this act].

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
