DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An Act requiring the Department of Highways to erect Indian historical markers along primary and interstate highways; and requiring Indian tribal governments in Montana to design the markers and designate the locations.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Signs will be similar in size to the historical signs.
- 2. Cost will be similar to historical signs.
- 3. A rock or concrete base will not be used due to liability issue with "clear zones".
- 4. FY90 will be used to design the signs, costs will be incurred in FY91 only.
- 5. The expenses will be funded with Highway State Special Revenue Account.
- 6. Signs will be placed on locations where no turnout is needed.
