Section 1. Section 19-9-1011, MCA, is amended to read:

"19-9-1011. Allowance adjustment. (1) A monthly allowance paid under section 31(3), Chapter 456, Laws of 1977 (formerly section 11-1890(3), R.C.M. 1947), 19-9-804, 19-9-903, or 19-9-911 to a member retired on or after July 1, 1975, but-before-July-1,-1985, or to his surviving spouse or dependent child may not be less than one-half the monthly compensation paid on-July-1,-1985, to a newly confirmed, active police officer of the city that last employed the member as a police officer, as provided each year in the budget of that city.

(2) At the beginning of each fiscal year, the administrator shall request and the state auditor shall pay to the administrator from the premium tax collected from insurance sold in this state to insure against the risks

enumerated in 19-11-512(3) an amount sufficient to fund the allowance adjustment provided for in subsection (1)."

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Extension of authority. Any existing authority to make rules on the subject of the provisions of [this act] is extended to the provisions of [this act].

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Effective date. [This act] is effective July 1, 1989.

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB604, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act providing an allowance adjustment for members of the Municipal Police Officers' Retirement System who retired on or after July 1, 1985; amending Section 19-9-1011, MCA; and providing an effective date.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Supplemental benefits paid to police officers shall be paid by the State Auditor from the premium tax fund (risks enumerated in 19-11-512(3), MCA). Obligations for supplemental benefits will not accrue to the retirement trust fund.
- 2. Supplemental benefits paid to pre-July 1, 1975 retirees will not be affected by this bill.
- 3. Estimates of the additional supplemental benefits required to be paid from the tax premium fund during FY90 and FY91 are based on historical salary increases granted in cities belonging to the Municipal Police Officers' Retirement System and the current benefits paid to members retired after 7-1-85. 106 retirees will receive additional supplemental benefits in FY90 and 117 retirees will receive additional supplemental benefits in FY91.

LONG-RANGE EFFECTS OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

The demand on this fund will increase as salaries of newly confirmed officers in member cities increase. As retirees and their beneficiaries die, supplemental benefits will decrease.

The annual unfunded liability payment of \$95,367 to the MPORS trust fund is scheduled to end after FY92; this will increase funds available to pay supplemental benefits and increase potential general fund revenue.
