Dear Representative Vincent and Senator Galt:

In accordance with the power vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Montana, I hereby veto the adoption of House Bill 618, "AN ACT TO INCREASE BY 4 PERCENT THE MAXIMUM GENERAL FUND BUDGET SCHEDULES FOR ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS AND HIGH SCHOOLS FOR SCHOOL FISCAL YEAR 1989-1990; TO APPROPRIATE FUNDS TO THE SUPERINTENDENT OF PUBLIC INSTRUCTION FOR STATE EQUALIZATION AID; AMENDING SECTIONS 20-9-316 AND 20-9-317, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE." for the following reasons.

House Bill 618 increases by four percent the maximum general fund budget schedule for elementary schools and high schools for fiscal year 1989-90. This four percent increase in the school foundation program virtually sidesteps the Montana Supreme Court mandate of school funding equalization as provided for in <u>Helena</u> <u>Elementary School District Number One, et al. v. State of</u> <u>Montana, et al.</u> The legislature is under a court mandate to eliminate disparities in school district expenditures per student and reliance on differences in local real property tax valuations. House Bill 618, with an appropriation of \$11,140,000 does not address either of these pressing issues.

I do not foreclose the possibility of providing schools a needed increase in state funding, but that increase must come in conjunction with a school equalization plan.

The legislature will be reviewing major school funding and tax reform again prior to July 1, 1989. Resolution of school equalization will not be resolved by increases in the existing foundation program schedule which has been declared The Honorable John Vincent The Honorable Jack Galt May 11, 1989 Page Two

unconstitutional. House Bill 618 detracts from that court mandated resolution. It adds state dollars to a financial system whose existence will terminate. In fiscally tight times, Montana educators cannot become captive to a mentality that additional government dollars will solve the problem. There has been no compelling public policy interest demonstrated to me for passage of House Bill 618.

Recognizing that the real need of schools is for a permanent solution to fixed budgets in inflationary times, a solution House Bill 618 does not provide, I have today signed into law Senate Bill 65. This legislation allows school districts to raise necessary revenue when taxable value drops more than 5 percent in any one year.

Given the value of Senate Bill 65 to our schools in relation to the questionable benefits of House Bill 618, I have vetoed House Bill 618.
