11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
12	Section 1. Section 53-1-401, MCA, is amended to read:
13	*53-1-401. Definitions. As used in this part, unless
14	the context requires otherwise, the following definitions
15	apply:
16	(1) "Ancillary charge" means the expense of providing
17	identifiable, direct, resident service-expenses-as-budgeted,
18	services, including but not limited to:
19	(a) operatingroom; anesthesia; physicians' services;
20	(b) x-ray <sub>7</sub> and laboratory <sub>7</sub> services;
21	(c) dental services;
22	(d) blood-bank,-oxygen-therapy, speech pathology and
23	audiology services;
24	(e) occupational and physical therapy7;
25	(f) medical supply, supplies;

1 <u>(g)</u>	drug,	prescribed	drugs;	and
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- 2 (h) specialized medical equipment expenses.
- 3 (2) "Care" means the care, treatment, support,
  4 maintenance, and other services rendered by the department
  5 to a resident.
- 6 (3) "Department" means the department of institutions
  7 provided for in Title 2, chapter 15, part 23.
- 8 (4) "Financially responsible person" means a spouse of
  9 a resident, the natural or adoptive parents of a resident
  10 under 18 years of age, or a guardian or conservator to the
  11 extent of the guardian's or conservator's responsibility for
  12 the financial affairs of the person who is a resident under
  13 applicable Montana law establishing the duties and
  14 limitations of guardianships or conservatorships.
  - (5) "Full-time equivalent resident load" means the total daily resident count for the fiscal year divided by the number of days in the year.
- 18 (6) "Long-term resident" means a resident in an institution listed in 53-1-402 for a continuous period in 20 excess of 120 days. No absence of a resident from the 21 institution due to a temporary or trial visit may be counted 22 as interrupting the accrual of the 120 days required to 23 attain the status of a long-term resident.
- 24 (7) "Per diem" means the gross daily <u>budgeted</u> cost of 25 operating an institution <u>as-budgeted</u>, <u>or an individual unit</u>

- 1 of an institution (including certain contracted medical
- 2 services, depreciation, and associated department costs but
- 3 excluding the cost of educational programs, federal grants,
- 4 ancillary charges, and costs not directly identified with
- 5 patient care) divided by the full-time equivalent resident
- 6 load.
- 7 (8) "Resident" means any person who is receiving care
- 8 from or who is a resident of an institution listed in
- 9 53-1-402.
- 10 (9) "Third-party resource" means but is not limited to
- 11 applicable medicare, medicaid, and personal health care
- 12 benefits."

- 13 Section 2. Section 53-1-402, MCA, is amended to read:
- 14 "53-1-402. Residents subject to per diem and ancillary
- 15 charges. The department shall assess and collect and-process
- 16 per diem and ancillary payments charges for the care of
- 17 residents in the following institutions:
- 18 (1) Montana state hospital;
  - (2) Montana developmental center;
- 20 (3) Montana veterans' home;
- 21 (4) Montana center for the aged;
- 22 (5) Eastmont human services center."
- 23 Section 3. Section 53-1-407, MCA, is amended to read:
- 24 "53-1-407. Appeal of determination of ability to pay.
- 25 If a resident or financially responsible person disagrees

- 1 with the final determination of the department as to his
- 2 ability to pay any part of the per diem or ancillary charge,
- 3 an appeal may be filed within 30 days of the date of the
- 4 department's determination in any court of record in Montana
- 5 having jurisdiction of the resident or financially
- 6 responsible person liable for payment."

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A bill for an act entitled: "An act to revise the laws relating to per diem and ancillary charges for the care of residents at state institutions; amending Sections 53-1-401, 53-1-402, and 53-1-407, MCA; and providing an effective date."

#### **ASSUMPTIONS:**

- 1. The impact of this bill is to generally revise for clarity and intent, the provisions for defining per diem and ancillary and to clearly address the Department of Institutions authority regarding assessing and collecting charges for patient care.
- 2. This bill is a "housekeeping" matter to clarify existing problems that have been raised in the past with insurance carriers and legislative audits relative to the various terms that the Department assesses costs for and bills private parties.
