STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

Form 20-15

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB675, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

HB675 would generally revise the law relating to management of alfalfa leaf-cutting bees, including establishing an unrestricted area classification and increasing committee responsibilities.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. There will continue to be 87 registered beekeepers, for whom the registration fee will decrease from \$50 to \$15 because the registration sample would no longer be required. Revenue decreases by \$3,045 per annum.
- 2. Certification fees determined on a per pound basis will be deleted, resulting in a revenue decrease each year. An \$8,000 per year revenue projection had been used for each year of the 1991 blennium.
- 3. Rules will be adopted for certification sampling fees based on mileage, per diem and hourly fee costs, which are projected at \$2.750 per year.
- 4. The number of lab samples will remain unchanged and the revenue from STIP interest, late fees and sale of lab bees will remain consistent. Other miscellaneous revenue decreases from the authority originally requested for the current law budget.
- 5. Contract services will be utilized laboratory analysis in the amount of approximately \$6,000 per year. This will be offset by a 1.00 FTE reduction from the recommended executive budget.
- 6. Current law figures below are as included in the executive budget.
