DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to require a social and economic impact analysis of any wildlife habitat acquisition by the Fish and Game Commission.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Only those proposals which would effect tax revenue or significantly change the current status will require comprehensive analysis.
- 2. The maximum number of proposals requiring a comprehensive analysis would not exceed five during the 1991 biennium.
- 3. Existing staff of the Department of Fish, Wildlife and Parks will prepare the analysis as a part of the current land acquisition process.

FISCAL IMPACT:

None.

EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUE OR EXPENDITURES:

County offices will be required to provide landowner-specific tax information relative to each proposal.
