DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

Delays GA payments for 30 days after eligibility is established.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The legislation will delay payments for 4,697 cases in both fiscal years.
- 2. The average GA payment is assumed to be \$212/case/month.
