HELP FUND A FEASIBILITY STUDY OF A BILLINGS-AREA RESERVOIR FOR RECREATION 9 WHEREAS, the Billings area needs additional reservoir water for various uses, including recreation; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the 1988 drought demonstrated the Yellowstone River Basin, including the Billings area, could 12 13 benefit substantially from additional off-stream storage; 14 and 15 WHEREAS, Montana's development 16 specifically contemplates off-stream storage development as 17 one of its major objectives; and 18 WHEREAS, the United States Bureau of Reclamation has 19 made a good-faith commitment to explore reservoir potentials 20 in the Billings area; and 21 WHEREAS, the United States Bureau of Reclamation's 22 efforts include preparation of a preliminary appraisal, in 23 cooperation with state agencies, indicating that 24 benefits of a reservoir at the Valley Creek site could 25 exceed costs; and

WHEREAS, Yellowstone County's local governments firmly support efforts to explore development of the Valley Creek Reservoir site; and

WHEREAS, a thorough feasibility study that uses current economic conditions in evaluating the recreational, water supply, wildlife, and possible hydropower benefits associated with reservoir development may describe a very attractive project for federal or private funding; and

WHEREAS, construction of a reservoir at the Valley Creek site or possibly at other sites in the Billings area would provide valuable off-stream storage, recreational, and other benefits.

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BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Appropriation. There is appropriated \$100,000 from the water development special revenue account for the biennium ending June 30, 1991, to Yellowstone County to use as matching money in conducting a feasibility study with the United States bureau of reclamation on reservoir development in the Billings area, particularly at the Valley Creek site. If full funding of the \$100,000 appropriation is not available from the water development special revenue account, there is appropriated from the renewable resource development account any remaining money necessary to provide full funding of the

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

HB760 would appropriate \$100,000 to Yellowstone County to help fund a feasibility study of the Valley Creek Reservoir or other Billings-area site for recreation or other purposes. ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The \$100,000 would be appropriated from the water development account.
- This Yellowstone County project would have a higher priority than the ten projects which have been 2. proposed by the Governor and recommended by the Long Range Planning Committee (LRPC).
- The ten water development projects recommended in L.C. No. 1783 total \$517,168 for the 1991 biennium. 3.
- The three lowest priority projects recommended by the LRPC would be impacted as follows: 4.

The projects for the town of Dutton and the town of Poplar would not be funded and it appears likely that the Huntley Irrigation District project funding would be reduced by 58%. TECHNICAL NOTES:

- The LRPC has reviewed this proposed Billings-area project and recommended a \$10,000 renewable resource development grant for the 1991 biennium.
- There is no mechanism to determine whether funding of the proposed appropriation is "available" from 2. the water development account (page 2, line 22). All available funds are recommended to be appropriated in L.C. No. 1783.
