In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for HB761, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An Act establishing an income tax voluntary checkoff to provide funds for search and rescue operations; designating that the Department of Justice use the checkoff revenue to supplement funding of search and rescue operations conducted under the supervision of county sheriffs' offices; establishing a search and rescue account; appropriating money from the General Fund to the Search and Rescue Account.

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Approximately 1,800 individuals will use the checkoff in each year of the biennium. (Department of Revenue)
- 2. Each contribution will be \$0.50.
- 3. The proposal will increase Department of Revenue administrative expenditures \$16,697 in FY90, and \$2,187 in FY91.

Dear Representative Vincent and Senator Galt:

In accordance with the power vested in me as Governor by the Constitution and laws of the State of Montana, I hereby veto the adoption of House Bill 761, "AN ACT ESTABLISHING AN INCOME TAX VOLUNTARY CHECKOFF TO PROVIDE FUNDS FOR SEARCH AND RESCUE OPERATIONS; DESIGNATING THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE USE THE CHECKOFF REVENUE TO SUPPLEMENT FUNDING OF SEARCH AND RESCUE OPERATIONS CONDUCTED UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF COUNTY SHERIFFS' OFFICES; ESTABLISHING A SEARCH AND RESCUE ACCOUNT; APPROPRIATING CHECKOFF FUNDS TO THE DEPARTMENT OF JUSTICE; AND AMENDING SECTION 7-32-235, MCA." for the following reasons.

On April 14, 1989, I vetoed House Bill 444, an income tax checkoff for the Legacy Legislature. In that veto message I stated that to further expand the individual income tax checkoff for fund raising activity as an alternative to the legislative appropriations is not wise. The result extends the length of an already complex tax return form. It creates additional taxpayer frustrations at income tax time. The State's tendency to expand tax alternatives must be curtailed.

It is estimated that this income tax checkoff will raise less than \$2,000 in the biennium. The administrative costs of processing this checkoff could potentially cost more than \$18,000. This is a bad tax policy. This is an example of growth in government spending without a demonstrated benefit.

I realize again that there are numerous worthy programs that would seek an opportunity for further tax checkoff privileges. However, a compelling public policy interest has not been demonstrated to me to allow further governmental expansion in this money raising procedure. The search and rescue operations will maintain the optional funding provided to counties as provided in Section 7-32-235, MCA.
