- (d) The Montana state library shall develop and use a recordkeeping system to identify the private sector users of the natural heritage program data bases and services. The use data must be provided to appropriate entities of the legislature for use in decisions on the long-term funding of the natural heritage program.
- (e) If the grant is funded at the approved level, money collected from the charging system developed under subsection (3)(a) must be deposited in the reclamation and development account. If the grant is funded at less than the

approved level, money collected from the charging system 1 developed under subsection (3)(a) must be deposited in the 2 Montana state library account to offset the costs of the natural heritage program, AND SUCH DEPOSITS ARE HEREBY APPROPRIATED. These deposits, when combined 5 with the available funding, may not exceed the amount of the approved 6

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Coordination of fund sources 8 9 for grants program projects. A sponsor of a grants program 1.0 project who has applied for a grant for that project under both the reclamation and development grants program and 11 12 either the water development program or the renewable 13 resource development program may not receive duplicative 14 funding.

NEW SECTION. Section 4. Conditions 15 grants. Disbursement of grant funds under [this act] is subject to 16 the following conditions that must be met by the project 17 18 sponsor:

- (1) A scope of work and budget for the project must be approved by the department of natural resources conservation. Reduction in a scope of work or budget may not affect priority activities or improvements.
- (2) Other funds required for project completion must have been committed, and the commitment must be documented.
- 25 (3) The project sponsor shall show satisfactory

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completion of conditions described in the recommendations section of the project narrative of the reclamation and development grants program report for the 1990-91 biennium.

- (4) An agreement between the department and the grant applicant must be executed in a timely manner, taking into consideration any changed conditions or circumstances that govern the administration and disbursement of funds.
- (5) Any other specific requirements considered necessary by the department must be met to accomplish the purpose of the grant as evidenced from the application to the department or as defined by the legislature.

NEW SECTION. **Section 5.** Appropriations established. For any entity of state government that receives a grant under [this act], an appropriation is established for the amount of the grant upon award of the grant by the department of natural resources and conservation.

NEW SECTION. Section 6. Reversion of funds. All funds allocated to the grants reclamation and development special revenue account under [this act] that are unspent and unencumbered on June 30, 1991, revert to that account.

NEW SECTION. Section 7. Severability. If a part of [this act] is invalid, all valid parts that are severable from the invalid part remain in effect. If a part of [this act] is invalid in one or more of its applications, the part remains in effect in all valid applications that are

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severable from the invalid applications.
