

9 (c) That the Speaker and Minority Leader of the House10 review and approve the timesheets for their employees.

(d) That the Chief Clerk of the House and the
 Secretary of the Senate review all timesheets and approve
 those not otherwise provided for.

(3) That the positions classified at Grade 17 and 14 above be exempt from overtime pay. During a regular 15 16 legislative session, employees in such positions must be paid for 48 hours a week regardless of the number of hours 17 worked. Whenever such employees are preparing for or closing 18 a regular or special session or otherwise working at the 19 direction of their respective presiding officers during an 20 interim, they must be paid for each hour worked at the 21 22 hourly compensation determined under subsection (1) and their timesheets must be reviewed and approved by their 23 24 presiding officers.

(4) (a) That, except as provided in subsection (4)(b),

25

1 the positions classified below Grade 17 be subject to 2 overtime pay. Hours over 40 a week worked by an employee so 3 classified must be compensated at the rate of 1 1/2 times 4 the employee's regular hourly wage.

5 (b) Legislative Assistants to the Majority and
6 Minority Leaders may work up to 48 hours a week.

7 (5) That the legislative employees listed in subsection (1)(b) be considered temporary employees and not 8 9 entitled to any additional benefits, such as sick leave, vacation leave, holiday pay, time off with pay, health 10 11 insurance, or longevity allowances. Section 2-18-617(3), MCA, relating to assumption of liability for accrued 12 13 vacation credits, does not apply to the Legislature and its 14 employees.

15 (6) That a Chaplain be entitled to be paid for 2 hours16 for each legislative day served.

17 (7) That membership in the Public Employees'
18 Retirement System be made available to legislative employees
19 upon written request under the provisions of section
20 19-3-403(5), MCA.

(8) That the Legislature intends this Joint Resolution
to apply to the employees hired to prepare for the 52nd
Legislature by the leadership elected at the November 1990
caucuses and that if state employees are authorized to
receive step increases by action of the 51st Legislature,

the second sentence of subsection (1)(b) of this resolution be replaced by the following: "A person who has served as a legislator or an employee of the Montana House of Representatives or the Senate for at least one-half of a regular session is entitled to be advanced one step for each session served. However, service in the 1987 session may not be counted."
