A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA ENCOURAGING STATE AGENCIES TO USE POSITIVE RATHER THAN NEGATIVE CHECKOFFS IN ADMINISTERING DEDUCTIONS OF CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTIONS FROM FUNDS HANDLED BY THE STATE.

WHEREAS, the state, through its agencies, departments, and other public instrumentalities, administers the deduction of funds for charitable donations through the use of checkoff systems; and

WHEREAS, it is laudable and appropriate that the state allows the citizens of Montana and the users of state facilities to make direct contributions to charitable or other nonprofit organizations by having money withheld or designated through the use of an automatic checkoff system; and

WHEREAS, checkoff systems can be either positive, whereby the donor affirmatively designates distribution of a certain sum of money to a particular charity or nonprofit group, or negative, whereby a person other than the donor designates the amount to be contributed or the recipient of the contributions, while providing the donor only the

opportunity to negate the donation by affirmatively refusing

2 to authorize it.

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4 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE 5 OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

That state offices discourage the use of negative checkoffs and encourage the use of a positive checkoff system for charitable contributions.

9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State
