١0	WHEREAS, Montana's 106,000 veterans constitute the
11	third largest per capita number of veterans in the United
12	States who look to the Veterans' Administration to provide
13	for their health needs; and
14	WHEREAS, among World War II veterans from all the
15	states, Montanans suffered the second largest casualty rate,
16	and many of the older veterans need medical and surgical
17	treatment, as well as nursing home care, but are unable to
18	afford private medical care programs; and
19	WHEREAS, these veterans are being advised to seek
20	medical assistance from state- or county-funded programs;
21	and
22	WHEREAS, the veterans' facility at Fort Harrison has no
23	nursing home unit, and the medical and surgical hospital
24	beds at both Fort Harrison and Miles City have been reduced
26	hu a babal of 50 bode, and

WHEREAS, the Fort Harrison and Miles City veterans' 1 hospitals will each have budget deficits in 1989 exceeding \$1 million; and

WHEREAS, this funding shortage in the Veterans' Administration has resulted in fewer eligible veterans being treated at Montana's veterans' hospitals and has left hundreds of Montana veterans without needed medicine; and

WHEREAS, Veterans' Administration employees in Montana have worked beyond their required job limits in a superior effort to care for our veterans; and

WHEREAS, the United States government has pledged to provide medical care for its veterans.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

That the 51st Legislature implore the Congress of the United States to pass legislation endorsing a supplemental appropriation to fund and staff the Veterans' Administration Medical Centers at Fort Harrison and Miles City to fully utilize all the medical and surgical beds, to reopen the closed ward at the Fort Harrison facility, and to proceed with a plan to construct and staff a 120-bed Veterans' Administration nursing home care unit at Fort Harrison.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Secretary of State send copies of this resolution to the President of the
