2	INTRODUCED BY Bradles Jacoleson Son Sol
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4	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF
5	REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA REQUESTING AN
6	INTERIM STUDY ON ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE; AND REQUIRING A REPORT
7	OF THE FINDINGS OF THE STUDY TO THE 52ND LEGISLATURE.

9	WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is a devastating health
10	condition that destroys vital brain cells, causes
11	progressive loss of memory and mental functions, and
12	eventually robs its victims of the ability to speak and
13	recognize close friends and relatives; and
14	WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease is the fourth leading
15	cause of death among the elderly and is believed to affect
16	approximately 10% of all persons over 65 years of age and
17	more than 20% of all persons over the age of 80; and
18	WHEREAS, Alzheimer's disease imposes serious financial,
19	social, and emotional hardships upon the families of its
20	victims and has a significant impact on the state Medicaid
21	budget; and
22	WHEREAS, at this time there is no known cause or cure
23	for Alzheimer's disease; and
24	WHEREAS, early and accurate diagnosis of Alzheimer's

disease is crucial because a significant number of persons

1	who are thought to be afflicted with the disease actually
2	suffer from depression or other treatable disorders.
3	
4	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE
5	OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
6	That the Legislature establish an appropriate interim
7	committee on Alzheimer's disease.
8	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the committee:
9	(1) examine the problems of Alzheimer's disease in
10	this state;
11	(2) assess the adequacy of current programs and
12	services available for victims of Alzheimer's disease; and
13	(3) determine the need for new policies, programs, or
14	services to aid the victims of Alzheimer's disease and their
15	families.
16	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the committee report its
17	findings and options for legislative action to the 52nd
18	Legislature and, if appropriate, prepare legislation to
19	implement these options.
