SENATE BILL NO. 20

INTRODUCED BY WILLIAMS

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT DECREASING TO 5 THE
MAXIMUM NUMBER OF PUPIL-INSTRUCTION-RELATED DAYS THAT MAY BE
CONDUCTED DURING A SCHOOL YEAR; AMENDING SECTION 20-1-304,
MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 20-1-304, MCA, is amended to read:

"20-1-304. Pupil-instruction-related day. A
pupil-instruction-related day shall be a day of teacher
activities devoted to improving the quality of instruction.
Such activities may include but are not limited to
in-service training, attending state meetings of teacher
organizations, and conducting parent conferences. A maximum
of 7 5 pupil-instruction-related days may be conducted
during a school year, provided that such days are approved
by the superintendent of public instruction in accordance
with the policy adopted by the board of public education.
Such days shall not be included as a part of the required
minimum of 180 days of pupil instruction."

Section 2. Effective date. [This act] is effective on
passage and approval.
