10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

11 **Section 1. Extension of eligibility for medical**
12 **assistance to persons terminated from aid to families with**
13 **dependent children. (1) The department of social and**
14 **rehabilitation services shall provide for the extension of**
15 **eligibility for medical assistance to persons who lose**
16 **eligibility for aid to families with dependent children due**
17 **to employment in accordance with section 1925 of Title XIX**
18 **of the Social Security Act [42 U.S.C. 1396r-6].**

19 (2) In providing for the extension of eligibility for
20 medical assistance under subsection (1), the department
21 shall provide for health insurance or other health coverage
22 in accordance with subsections 1925(a)(4)(B) and
23 1925(b)(4)(C) of Title XIX of the Social Security Act [42
24 U.S.C. 1396r-6(a)(4)(B) and 42 U.S.C. 1396r-6(b)(4)(C)] and
25 may exercise the other options contained in section 1925 of

1 Title XIX of the Social Security Act [42 U.S.C. 1396r-6]
2 regarding the provision of medical assistance.

3 **Section 2. Extension of authority.** Any existing
4 authority to make rules on the subject of the provisions of
5 [this act] is extended to the provisions of [this act].

6 **Section 3.** Codification instruction. [Section 1] is
7 intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 53,
8 chapter 6, part 1, and the provisions of Title 53, chapter
9 6, part 1, apply to [section 1].

10 **Section 4.** Effective dates. (1) [Section 1] is
11 effective on the date the federal act becomes effective.

12 (2) [Sections 2, 3, and this section] are effective on
13 passage and approval.

In compliance with a written request, there is hereby submitted a Fiscal Note for SB067, as introduced.

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act to extend medical assistance eligibility for persons who lose eligibility for aid to families with dependent children due to employment; and providing an effective date.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Fifty additional AFDC cases will qualify for extended medical benefits each month due to employment beginning April of 1990 and will peak in November of 1990.
2. The additional cost for each case receiving extended medical benefits will be \$346 per month.
3. The federal medicaid matching rate is 71.17% in FY90 and 71.28% in FY91.
